Dear Senator,

Massachusetts has an opportunity to lead the nation on clean energy and climate change policy, and federal developments make leadership on the state level especially crucial. The undersigned organizations support "An Act Creating 21st Century Massachusetts Clean Energy Jobs" (SD2049), filed by Senator Pacheco, and we urge you to sign on as a co-sponsor.

Currently, over 100,000 people in Massachusetts work in the clean energy industry. This legislation will continue the dramatic increase in clean tech jobs, build on our position as the strongest state for energy efficiency, and help us reach the requirements of the Global Warming Solutions Act.

Specifically, this multi-faceted bill will help contribute to the economic, environmental and health benefits of adding more renewable energy resources by increasing the Renewable Portfolio Standard and securing more offshore wind energy. It will also cement Massachusetts as #1 for energy efficiency, by requiring home energy audits prior to home sales and allowing for new financing tools to help homeowners and businesses invest in energy efficiency and renewable power upgrades. Other important provisions of this legislation would pave the way for modernizing our power grid while protecting consumers and developing cost-effective energy storage technologies.
