TRAINING REGISTRATION POLICIES & PROCEDURES

Prior to registering for upcoming trainings, please review the below policies. Individuals are responsible for managing their own professional development and when attending trainings offered through Child Care Aware of New Hampshire they are expected to adhere to the training registration policies as outlined below. We encourage all trainees to select trainings that meet their needs and will support their professional development in a meaningful and intentional way. If you are a center director, we would encourage you to post these policies with the training calendar and consider addressing these at your next staff meeting. We appreciate your support and help as we ensure that trainings offered are well attended and utilized by trainees.

- **Pre-registration is required.** Space is limited, so register as early as possible. Should a session be full, a wait list will be maintained. When space opens up, you will receive an email from Eventbrite or the Registry indicating that you have come off of the wait list. You have 24 hours to respond to this notification and register before your space is offered to someone else.
- **All training registration is done through Eventbrite or through the NH Professional Registry** (Visit www.nh.childcareaware.org for more info. on the Registry). Trainings in Eventbrite are trainings with a cost and trainings available for registration in the NH Professional Registry are at no cost. Please look for registration links on the Training Calendar page to determine how to register. **CCAoNH trainings are now listed in red for easy access.**

- **Training Registration is the 1st of each month.** As training comes first, before the hours, our training registration window is the 1st of the month. Please note that the registration window opens regardless of what day of the week it lands on. What is a “training registration window”? A training registration window is when registration opens for a training. When the window is open you can register. Essentially, trainings can be registered on a monthly basis.
- **A minimum of 10 registered people are required to hold a training.**
- **Child Care Aware of NH Staff add trainings registered for through Eventbrite into the NH Professional Registry for NH Professional Registry Users.** If you register for a paid training or event through Eventbrite, this training will be added to your registry record and you will have it available on your training transcript once you complete the training. You will be getting a confirmation email from Eventbrite with your ticket that you are registered and will also be receiving an email from the Registry indicating that you are enrolled. If you have questions about this, please contact our Professional Development Support Coordinator, Shannon Quinn at 603-323-7091 or one of our regional outreach offices.
- **IMPORTANT!!! Training Registrants are required to arrive to the training prior to the advertised start time of the training.** We are unable to accept late arrivals to trainings. To maintain the professional integrity of the training being offered and to respect time of the trainer and trainees, please arrive prior to the start of the training. Your cooperation is appreciated.
- **Training Registration Fees are non-refundable. Training with a cost must be paid for through Eventbrite.**
- **Training registrations are non-transferable.** We do not limit the number of people who register per program. We register the individual, not the program. Please note that if you are not able to attend you cannot replace yourself with another individual, as that is done through our wait list process through Child Care Aware of NH. If you are not able to attend you will need to cancel your registration and withdraw.
- **If you need to cancel your registration for a training offered in the Registry,** please go into your online profile and withdraw from the training. If you do not withdraw by the day of the training, a “no show” will be placed on your training transcript for that training and space won’t open up for those on a potential wait list.
- **If you need to cancel your registration for a training offered in Eventbrite.** If the training on Eventbrite had a cost please call the Training and Technical Assistance Line at your local Child Care Aware of NH Regional Outreach Office to cancel. Please note that registration fees are non-refundable and non-transferable. If the training on Eventbrite is free, you can cancel your own registration by going into Eventbrite and doing so.
- **If a training is cancelled by Child Care Aware of NH,** all registered participants will be notified via email with the registration information provided. Please check your email prior to attending a training, as sometimes cancellations are last minute.
- **When a training with a fee is cancelled by Child Care Aware of NH,** participants will be refunded their registration fee. Trainings may be rescheduled at the discretion of the Child Care Aware of NH. In this case, participants would need to re-register but would be given priority registration.
- **Training information is available through our e-newsletters in a separate Training Calendar e-newsletter announcement and/or through the “Monthly Minutes” and/or “At-A-Glance” editions.** Trainings are also posted on our website at www.nh.childcareaware.org, at www.snhs.org and on the NH Professional Registry. To be added to our e-newsletter list, please email outreach2ccrr@snhs.org with Subject Line “E-Newsletter” and include your name, the child care program you work at and the city in which you work.

- **The NH Professional Registry's captures all trainee's training. The Training Transcript section of each individual Registry User's account can be printed out and used for documentation purposes.** The Registry captures trainee completion under Training History in each trainee's registry record. This information can be used for proof of attendance for licensing and for credentialing purposes. Simply print it out or send your director an email copy for your file. Training certificates will only be issued at conferences. If you need assistance navigating the Registry please give us a call. We'd be happy to assist you.
- **Courtesy Training Reminder/Confirmation Calls will not be conducted by Child Care Aware of NH.** You are responsible for documenting your training registration, remembering to go and attending the trainings you are registered for.
- **Child Care Aware of NH reserves the right to revoke training privileges** from individuals who do not adhere to these policies and/or act in an inappropriate manner at a Child Care Aware of NH training.
- **Child Care Aware of NH Trainings will be offered in the months of January to June and August to December.** Child Care Aware of NH will not be offering trainings in the months of July, August and January. These months are reserved for provider updates and database maintenance.

When planning your professional development for the year, please keep in mind the following:

- Full day conferences are offered throughout the year in the months of September, March, May and November.
- Trainings are not offered in the months July and August.
- Training topics are scheduled in a twelve-month time period. Efforts are made to provide training topics throughout the state. If you see a training offered outside of your region in one quarter you will most likely see it offered in your region the next quarter and vice versa pending trainer availability, travel needs and funding.
- Please note that some training locations may be listed as "To Be Determined" or "TBD". Once locations are confirmed, they will be listed in the NH Professional Registry or Eventbrite depending upon registration method being used.

A Different Look at Challenging Behaviors

98% of challenging behaviors are the result of a mismatch of temperament between adults and children. How can we be more aware of this mismatch and what can be done about it? Understanding our own behavior and a child's development is critical to ensuring that every child we relate to and interact with is visible, valued and supported in their own way. Together, we will discover the layers of possibilities waiting to unfold and the strengths each child brings to this world. These will be revealed through a research-based model of temperament that honors the differences among us.

Advanced Training Series: Making the Hours Count- Providing Meaningful Training for Your Staff

During this training series, designed for those qualified* by Child Care Licensing Unit (CCLU) requirements as "directors" and/or "trainers", we will explore ideas and techniques for training your staff and coordinating with other early childhood programs. The nuts and bolts of providing trainings, as outlined by the CCLU, will also be discussed. An emphasis on documentation will be included, as well as the importance and value of credentialing. We'll delve into fundamental training components such as training agendas, learning outcomes, core knowledge area/s, certificates of attendance, assessment, implementation, and reflection. Participants will also prepare and provide a training to staff and/or to other early childhood professionals as a requirement of this Advanced Training opportunity. Participants will walk away from this series prepared to provide training that will satisfy licensing requirements and meet their staff's needs. Participants must attend all trainings within the series to complete the Advanced Training Series and obtain a certificate of completion. *Per CCLU Licensing Rules, see page 91 (trainer requirements) and 98 (director qualifications). The target audience for this training is Intermediate and Advanced.



Assessing Your Rules of Engagement: Strengths Based Assessment with Families in Program & Classroom Environments

Quality family engagement practices are central to our work with young children and families in classroom and program environments. But, where does it begin? How do you know if your approaches are effective and meaningful? Assessment can help! It begins with strengths based work with children and families-building capacity and protective factors known to optimize child development and growth, strengthen families and minimize occurrences of child abuse and neglect. Strengthening Families is a national initiative developed through the Center for the Study of Social Policy (CSSP) that provides a framework of protective factors and strategies to guide strengths based work with children and families. Come discover the Strengthening Families Assessment Tool offered as a free resource through the CCSP and other strategies for successful family work in classrooms and programs. During our time together we will look at what it mean to be "strengths based", what are "rules of engagement" and the barriers to successful engagement and the assessment tool, resources and opportunities to engage families and develop relationships that are meaningful, collaborative and that work! The targeted audience for this training is Foundational and Intermediate.

Calling All Learners: Creating Inclusive and Respectful Classroom Culture **Saturday Special/Three Part Training In One Saturday**

- **Part One: "Helping young children understand differences: Getting to the roots of inclusion"**
Young children are naturally curious and begin to understand the world by recognizing human differences from a young age. Early Childhood professionals have an important role in helping young children develop a foundation of respect and inclusion. This training will focus on practical strategies for helping young children understand and appreciated differences.
- **Part Two: "Transitions, Traditions, Routines & Rituals: Learning where you would least expect it"**
Putting coats away, transitioning from activity to activity, putting things away, washing hands, cleaning up, etc. These things seem to happen day in day out, whether we think about them or not. By carefully attending to transitions, traditions, routines and rituals early childhood professionals have the opportunity to foster positive relationships, build social skills and create a positive classroom/program culture. This training will

- **Part Three: “Creating Meaningful Family Involvement Plans: Work Session”**

Family engagement is a cornerstone of a thriving positive and respectful program culture. Family involvement in early childhood programs has been associated with positive child outcomes such as, social competence, communication skills, cognitive development and expressive language skills. This training will present a framework for creating comprehensive family involvement plans, which participants will create as part of the training.

Child Care Basic: 1, 2, 3 Grow With Me

This training will focus on the foundations of learning for young children. Discussion and group activities will focus on topics of early learning, brain development, areas of development and best practices to promote growth. The targeted audience level for this training is Foundational and those seeking review.

Child Care Basic: Caring for Infants and Toddlers

This training will focus on the importance of developing relationship-based practices that support attachment, infant and toddler development and developmentally appropriate curriculum. The Early Learning Standards, Infant and Toddler Competencies, and Credential endorsement will be introduced. The target audience for this training is Foundational, Intermediate and those seeking review.

Child Care Basic: Developing Cultural Competency in the Early Childhood Environment

This training will examine ways to create an environment that is respectful and welcoming to the diversity of families, cultures, and experiences of all children in your care. The targeted audience level for this training is Intermediate and those looking for review.

Child Care Basic: Emergent Curriculum for Emerging Learners

This training will begin with an overview of two early childhood theories that have helped to shape a developmentally appropriate approach to curriculum for children, birth through age eight. Participants will learn the value of emergent curriculum and how it addresses the Early Learning Standards, and will practice developing curriculum webs. Each participant will receive copies of curriculum developed during this training. This training meets the NH Licensed Plus requirement for an Early Learning Standards training. The target audience level for this training is Foundational, Intermediate and those seeking review.

Child Care Basic: Is This a Good Place for Me? Learning Spaces That Work

This training will provide an understanding of how the environment influences us. This understanding will position participants to understand the impact of settings on children. Participants will look at the ways early childhood environments speak to children and adults by influencing our many senses and emotions. Join us for an interactive learning experience with activities and resources to share with your colleagues. The targeted audience for this training is Intermediate and for those looking for review.

Child Care Basic: Providing Inclusive Care

Each child has specific needs and our job as early childhood professionals is to discover and address those needs to promote optimal growth and development. This training will provide an overview of federal law regarding inclusion as well as how to make accommodations to support the individual needs of children in child care settings and their families. The target audience level for this training is Foundational, Intermediate, Advanced and those seeking review.



CCB: Strengthening Families, Strengthening Care

This training addresses the benefits of positive family and provider relationships. Participants will examine communication methods and common barriers to relationship-building. The Strengthening Families approach will be introduced. The targeted audience for this training is Foundational, Intermediate and those seeking review.

Child Care Basic: Social Emotional Development of Young Children

This training will explore the components of healthy social emotional development in young children birth through age five years. How do young children experience, regulate, and express emotions? How do they form secure relationships? How do families and caregivers shape their child's development? We will discuss learning strategies to promote healthy development and self-regulation within the child care setting. The importance of collaborating with families will also be addressed. The targeted audience level for this training is Intermediate and for those seeking review.

Child Care Basic: What Are You Trying to Say? Behavior is An Attempt to Communicate:

This training will provide an overview of developmentally appropriate expectations of children's behavior. Together, we will address how children communicate through their behavior. Participants will develop strategies to promote desirable behavior. The target audience for this training is Foundational, Intermediate, Advanced and those seeking review.

Child Care Resource & Referral (CCR&R) Volunteer Program Orientation

Are you looking for more ways to obtain those professional development hours? Do you want to give back to the community in some fashion? At Child Care Aware of NH (CCR&R), we need volunteer help and we've created a program that we feel is a win-win for all. Volunteers will help monitor scheduled CCR&R trainings, assist training presenters, help our fabulous host sites with set-up and clean-up, and/or aid in the assistance of bulk program mailings. Benefits include registration to quarterly trainings, unlimited training attendance and professional development hours. Orientation is required to participate. Must be willing to submit credential application and be registered in the NH Professional Registry.

Childhood Lead Poisoning in NH: What Early Childhood Educators Need to Know

Each year close to 1000 children in New Hampshire are poisoned by lead and experience blood levels known to impair cognitive development. Lead poisoning in New Hampshire and the effects of even low-level lead exposure have on the brain's learning systems identified in study after study will be provided. Early Childhood Educators will develop an understanding of lead's "neurobehavioral signature"... significant negative impact on cognitive ability, speech and language, hearing, visual-spatial skills, attention, impulse control, social behaviors, emotional regulation and motor skills—that are irreversible and cause a life-time of consequences. Educational interventions for young children affected by lead and the importance of having results required lead screening tests documented on school health forms.

Food Allergies in a Nutshell

A review of common food allergies in children, including information regarding the diagnosis of food allergies and standard treatment strategies.

Infant Mental Health: What Is It and Why Is It Important

Early Childhood professionals have an important role in supporting the mental health and wellbeing of infants and toddlers. This training will begin by presenting a definition and overview of infant mental health. The importance of early relationships for healthy brain development and the role of secure attachments and self-regulation for infant mental health will be highlighted. Practical strategies for recognizing infant stress signals and promoting infant mental health will be a focus of the training.

Introduction to Brain Gym - With a Twist

Join us for this training full of movement, mindfulness and an invitation to get back to nature! Brain Gym is a movement based educational program that assists learners with whole brain integration. Coming from a whole-brain place allows choices, decisions and learning to be done with greater awareness and the ability to look at the big picture. Goals from this training include learning several of the 26 different Brain Gym movements along with suggestions for implementation with a wide variety of audiences. The twist is actually using these movements in conjunction with Mindfulness activities as well as weaving in touches of nature. Be prepared to move, breath, relax and embrace a mindful, whole brain atmosphere.



NH ECE Workforce Specialized Competencies: Tools for Professional Development

This training session introduces three sets of early childhood core knowledge competencies designed to be used by those who work in and with early childhood programs. Attendees will learn the meaning of competency and how to assess their own knowledge and skills, as well as how to work with child care program staff and other colleagues engaged in self-assessment of competencies. Discussion will include the many benefits of implementing these competency tools, especially for professional development. Experience the learning that takes place as participants share their knowledge and Aha! moments and take those revelations back to your program as you share the competencies with others. Competency Levels: Foundational, Intermediate, Advanced and Specialist.

Ouch That Hurts: The Multiple Perspectives of Biting

There are many reasons young children bite. Understanding why a child bites can often be the first step in developing a comprehensive approach to address biting. This interactive training will discuss the developmental nature of biting; reasons children might bite; the varying perspectives of the biting behavior (from the lens of the children, families, teachers, environment); immediate responses; as well as tips and strategies for curbing future biting. Participants struggling with biting in their classrooms are strongly encouraged to document and bring to the training the following details for discussion: (1) The time the child bit; (2) who was bitten and who else was nearby; (3) what the child was playing with and where they were in the classroom; (4) what the teacher was doing and where they were; and (5) whether there were any extenuating circumstances (sub in the room, fire drill day, etc.) or possible reasons for the biting.

Recognizing and Reporting Child Abuse & Neglect

Did you know you are mandated to report suspected child abuse and/or neglect? Do you know who to call? Do you know what signs to look for? Or what happens after you call? Come join us for this informative training and get these questions and more addressed! Participants will have the opportunity to define child abuse and neglect and examine the impact of maltreatment on a child's development. Participants will learn how best to respond to concerns about possible abuse and neglect and discover what their role is as a mandated reporter. In collaboration with the Division for Children, Youth and Families.

Reducing the Risk of SIDS and Sudden Unexpected Infant Death with Audrey Knight

This training will provide a review of Sudden Infant Death Syndrome and some of the causes of Sudden Unexpected Infant Death. Information regarding your role in carrying out the American Academy of Pediatrics' recommendations to reduce the risks and promote a safer sleep environment will be a focus of this training. A brief overview of what happens when an infant dies suddenly and unexpectedly in New Hampshire will be shared.

Surviving Multi-Generational Staff and Creating Strong Teams: How Do I Work with Them?

Today, it is very common in early childhood to have multi-generational teams. Each generation has its unique mindset, work style, and ways of communicating. Directors need to recognize how to motivate team members individually and capitalize on strengths each member brings to the team. Teaching teams need to understand attitudinal and behavioral differences among team members of different generations. This training will look at the 4 generations presently in the ECE workforce.



The Music and Movement In Me

Music and movement is one of a child's first forms of communication. A very young infant can inherently respond to sounds, beat, tempo and style. This session will remind early childhood professionals of the great joy within. We will tap into one's inner spirit to inspire curriculum activities for infants through preschool age children that can embrace learning domains. Participants will participate and learn through exploration of instruments, materials, movement and props.

Trauma-Informed Early Childhood Services

The Community Health Institute is supporting the NH Department of Health and Human Services Maternal and Child Health Section and early childhood trauma experts affiliated with the Department of Psychiatry at Dartmouth to implement this training project for providers of early childhood services, including: child care, home visiting and health and mental services. This training assists early childhood professionals to recognize and address emotional and behavioral challenges that arise from trauma, and prepares them to create home and class environments that promote learning and development through safe and supportive relationships. Presented by an approved

trained professional with content expertise in this topic. Addresses some Intermediate and Advanced level competencies.

Underdog or Top Dog: How Do You Define and Measure Your Own Success?

What will your signature legacy be? How can you triumph over the limited understanding many people have of our profession? Will you be underdog or top dog in having a professional impact? How much of your success will be measured from the outside in versus the inside out? Prepare to stake a claim to how you will make a signature difference regardless of restrictive views by others of our profession.



Understanding Homelessness and Its Impacts on Children and Families

During this training, participants will understand the general state of homelessness in NH. They will learn ways in which to how identify a homeless child and/or family. Understand the relationship between homelessness and trauma in children. Understand the physical and emotional impacts of homelessness, particularly on children. Understand the reactions and symptoms of trauma and homelessness in children. Understand best practices in serving children who experience homelessness. This training will incorporate a variety of teaching techniques including didactic presentation, small group discussions/brainstorms, videos, and opportunity for questions, dialogue and discussion.

Using Picture Books to Promote Early Childhood Mathematics

Come join us for this interactive training. We'll begin with an overview of the sequences of mathematics development in preschoolers. Next, we will explore a variety of developmentally appropriate teaching methods that can be used to introduce preschoolers to the concepts, methods, and language of mathematics. Participants will have the opportunity to explore quality picture books linked to key standards and plan how to use them in their classrooms.

Watch Me Grow, Ages and Stages, and Learn the Signs: Act Early

This training will focus on presenting information regarding the Center for Disease Control's Act Early Campaign and NH's Watch Me Grow system of developmental screening. Participants will discuss the importance of developmental screening and learn about resources available locally as well as from the Learn the Signs: Act Early Campaign. You will learn how to use the Ages and Stages Questionnaire and discuss the various ways you can use this developmental screening tool to have meaningful conversations with families about their children.

Working with Homeless Youth

This training will focus on our homeless youth. During this discussion, we will learn more about the impact of homelessness on children and how you can lessen that impact, find out how the McKinney Vento Act affects young children, and discover how challenging behavior and homelessness can go hand in hand.

Working with Multi-Stressed Families

In today's world, there are three types of situations we need to be prepared to work with: achieving outcomes in distressed families, sustaining competence in families experiencing stress, and helping families recover from traumatic events. While all families experience stress, ongoing or chronic distress erodes the family system in ways that lead to "the ecology of despair." This training examines ways to conquer the greatest of adversities.

Yoga for the Young Child

Teaching yoga to young children has many benefits not only physically but mentally and emotionally as well. Our young students are at a stage where they are increasing their body-awareness and they willingly participate in fun-filled classes designed to improve their ability to manage their bodies in space. With the use of puppets, children's literature and poetry in addition to pictures, music and fun props, students' develop an extensive repertoire of poses and breathing techniques. In addition to the physical aspects of yoga, the students spend lots of time working on social skills such as communication, sharing, problem-solving and working together as a team. We will also explore our emotions and how to understand and communicate what we are feeling to other's in our lives. The children learn techniques for coping with challenging emotions and behaviors as well as how to express their emotions in positive and creative ways. Yoga with young children is a time spent laughing, moving and breathing while exploring and discovering more about ourselves and our world.

Directors' & Leadership Collaboratives

Child Care Aware of NH offers collaborative meetings for Directors, Administrators, and other Early Childhood Leaders from September to June each year. These meetings are designed by each group in the region to reflect area needs and interests and to provide program leaders with Child Care Aware of NH program updates, essential local and state information with professional development opportunities. Registration is online at www.nh.childcareaware.org through the NH Professional Registry. The registration window does not need to be open for registration to begin. Licensing Approved Websites for Professional Development



The following is a list of training websites that have been approved by Child Care Licensing for Professional Development hours. You may accrue up to six hours* with on-line or correspondence training. On-line or correspondence training requires participation and involvement by the individual.

Real-time or live, facilitated webinars/training are approved as workshops per He-C 4002.30(c)(1). These are not limited to six hours as on-line training per He-C 4002.30(i). A viewing of a recorded presentation or movie will be considered self-study (with summary). Blogs, chat rooms and such are not counted toward professional development hours required per Child Care Licensing. On-line trainings without real-time or live facilitators are restricted to six hours per He-C 4002.30(i)

If an approved training listed below offers college credit, you must verify that the college is regionally accredited [see He-C 4002.32]. If an approved training offers CEU's those would have to be accepted by a regionally accredited college to be considered college credit. (See definition of regionally accredited college in section .01 of the Child Care Program Licensing Rules)

Professional Development Plans & Competencies

Professional Development (PD) Plans are an excellent way for early childhood professionals to consider what knowledge and skills they would like to acquire to further their individual goals and enhance their work with children and families. Through the use of teacher competencies, an early childhood professional can assess their current knowledge and skills in different core knowledge areas.

Professional Development Plans

Reflecting upon your professional development needs will better prepare you to complete your PD plans. By using the teacher competencies self-assessment in tandem with your PD plan you will find that it's easier to consider and articulate the areas in which you'd like to increase your knowledge and skills in.

Child Care Aware of NH has created an annual training calendar to give you the opportunity to view what professional development opportunities are being offered in a year timeframe. We hope this will better assist you in formulating a plan of action to obtain specific training that may meet your needs.

Directors and Administrators are beginning to utilize the teacher competencies and PD plans in their program. Both the competencies and PD plans are excellent tools to use with staff when conducting annual performance reviews. They allow both the Director and staff member to discuss areas of strength that the staff member brings to their work. They also prompt discussion on potential target areas for improvement or skill enhancement.
