Molly's Game (2017)

Running Time: 141 Minutes, Rated R (Drama)

Molly's Game is based on the true story of Molly Bloom, an Olympic-class skier who ran the world's most exclusive high-stakes poker game for a decade before being arrested in the middle of the night by 17 FBI agents wielding automatic weapons. Her players included Hollywood royalty, sports stars, business titans and finally, unbeknownst to her, the Russian mob. Her only ally was her criminal defense lawyer Charlie Jaffey, who learned that there was much more to Molly than the tabloids led us to believe.

Happy People: A Year in the Taiga (2010)

Running Time: 90 Minutes, Not Rated (Documentary)

Venerated documentarian Werner Herzog teams with director Dmitry Vasyukov for this observant look at life along the River Yenisei in northern Russia, where the industrious inhabitants of a rural village truly live off the land.

Tuesday, April 17, 2: 00 and 7:30

City Slickers (1991)

Running Time: 112 Minutes, Rated PG-13 (Comedy, Adventure)

For a change of pace, three amigos facing midlife crises sign on for a fortnight cattle drive through the Colorado hills. The urbanites' survival depends on a leathery trail boss who doesn't cotton to greenhorn city slickers.

Wednesday, April 18, 2:00 and 7:30

All the Money in the World (2017)

Running Time: 132 Minutes, Rated R (Drama, Crime Thriller)

The kidnapping of 16-year-old John Paul Getty III (Charlie Plummer) and the desperate attempt by his devoted mother, Gail (Michelle Williams), to convince his billionaire grandfather (Christopher Plummer) to pay the ransom. When Getty Sr. refuses, Gail attempts to sway him as her son's captors become increasingly volatile and brutal.

Best of Enemies (2015)

Running Time: 88 Minutes, Rated R (Documentary)

In 1968, two patrician intellectuals with opposite political views -- William F. Buckley Jr. and Gore Vidal -- participated in a series of televised debates that shocked America with their level of vitriol, as recounted in this riveting documentary.

Friday, April 20, 2:00 and 7:30

Phantom Thread (2017)

Running Time: 130 Minutes, Rated R (Drama, Romance)

Set in the glamour of the 1950's post-war London, renowned dressmaker Reynolds Woodcock (Daniel Day-Lewis) and his sister Cyril (Lesley Manville) are at the center of the British fashion, dressing royalty, movie stars, heiresses, socialites, debutants and dames with the distinct style of The House of Woodcock. Women come and go through Woodcock's life until he comes across a young, strong-willed woman, Alma (Vicky Krieps), who soon becomes a fixture in his life as his muse and lover. Once controlled and planned, he finds his carefully tailored life disrupted by the scariest curse of all...love.

The Wrestler (2008)

Running Time: 105 Minutes, Rated R (Sports Drama)

Mickey Rourke stars as retired professional wrestler Randy "The Ram" Robinson, who returns to the ring to work his way up the circuit for a final shot at defeating his longtime rival. Along the way, he tries to reconnect with his estranged daughter.
