Saturday Book Club. *Understanding our Muslim Friends*. The Library is collaborating with the Salisbury Congregational Church in a six-part series called Peace Through Understanding. We will be reading a book linked to the month's group.

"Persepolis" by Marjane Satrapi. Satrapi tells of her life in Iran from the age of 10 when the Islamic Revolution of 1979 reintroduced a religious state, through the age of 14 when the Iran-Iraq war forced her parents to send her to Europe for safety. This story, told in a graphic format with simple, but expressive black and white illustrations, combines the normal rebelliousness of an intelligent adolescent, with the horrors of war and totalitarianism.

Author Jay McInerney discusses his new book "Bright Precious Days". The White Hart Speaker Series presented in collaboration between The White Hart Inn, Oblong Books & Music and the Scoville Memorial Library. In his first novel in ten years McInerney returns to the Manhattan 'it' couple from his previous two novels *Brightness Falls* and *The Good Life*- Corinne and Russell Calloway - who still feel as if they're living the dream that drew them to New York City in the first place: book parties, art openings, high-society events, jobs they care about, twin children, a loft in TriBeCa and summers in the Hamptons. But all of this comes at a fiendish cost. Instead of chasing personal gain in this incredibly wealthy city, Corrine devotes herself to feed its hungry poor, and she and her husband soon discover they're being priced out of the newly fashionable neighborhood they've called home for most of their adult lives, with their son and daughter caught in the balance.
