CMS Introduces Advance Care Planning Billing Code for Physician Reimbursement

On January 1, 2016, CMS introduced an Advance Care Planning (ACP) billing code to reimburse physicians for discussing advance care planning with patients and their families. Below is information and requirements for billing:

- Conversations must be in-person discussions with the patient, patient's surrogate or family members.
- Patient does not need to have a specific diagnosis to have these conversations.
- Can be billed on the same day as an Evaluation and Management code, however, the document must clearly distinguish that the ACP time is not overlapping.
- Physicians, nurse practitioners and physician assistants (those that are eligible to independently bill Medicare for CPT services) are the only providers who can use these codes.
- There are 'incident to' rules that apply in the outpatient setting, which means a provider can perform the initial service, a team member can deliver part of the service, with supervision and involvement of the provider. 'Incident to' rules cannot be used in provider-based setting, hospital inpatient and outpatient and nursing home setting.

Documentation needs to include:

- Total time in minutes.
- Patient/surrogate/family "given the opportunity to decline."
- Details of the context (Who was involved? What was discussed? Understanding of the illness by patient or guardian, spiritual factors, why are they making the decision they are making? Was any advance directive offered/filled out? Follow-up.)

For Rural Health Clinics (RHC) and Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC):

- The ACP is a stand-alone billable visit.
- If furnished on the same day as another billable visit at the RHC or FQHC, only one visit will be paid.
- All other RHC or FQHC program requirements must be met.

In response to the CMS code, many other insurance companies are following suit and accept the ACP code, including:

- Anthem
- Harvard Pilgrim Healthcare
- Aetna
- Community Health Options

The chart below provides detail for ACP CPT Codes:

ACP CPT Code	Details	Time Requirement	Reimbursement	Co-payment
99497	Advance care planning including explanation and discussion of advance directives such as standard forms (with completion of such forms, when performed) by the physician or other qualified health professional; first 30 minutes, face-to-face with the patient, family member(s) and/or surrogate	If you meet or exceed 16 minutes	1.5 RVUs	Co-pay waived if included as part of annual wellness visit.
99498 – add-on CPT code	Each additional 30 minutes (list separately in addition to code for primary procedure)	Use both codes if you meet or exceed 46 minutes	1.4 RVUs	If conversation occurs at another visit, Part B cost sharing applies and patient may have copay/coinsurance

Please consult with and collaborate closely with your local billing compliance expert when using these codes.

DID YOU KNOW?

The minimum time requirement to meet the CMS Advance Care Planning billing code is 16 minutes and the time includes documentation? Other insurances are reimbursing for these discussions.

Delirium Detection and Treatment Video

As part of a grant awarded by HRSA, Sarah Hallen, MD, developed a framework to educate the interdisciplinary health care team with a goal of providing better care for hospitalized older adults.

The framework—titled “Concepts in Common”—distills and clarifies complex concepts while helping team members to understand their roles in providing better care, become more effective in recognizing delirium and taking appropriate and effective action for treatment.

As part of a joint educational effort between Maine Medical Partners Geriatrics and MaineHealth, Maine Medical Center’s, Rhonda Babine, MS, APRN, ACNS-BC, worked closely with Dr. Hallen to implement this model through the distribution of related materials throughout Maine Medical Center. Through research conducted, they discovered this model can also help with fall prevention. Sharon Foerster, LCSW, and program manager with MaineHealth’s Elder Care Services, worked with Dr. Hallen and Rhonda to create a video with a goal of proving broader access to the MaineHealth system. Did you know? Zika virus testing is covered under Medicare Part B

Zika virus disease is a nationally notifiable condition. Medicare covers Zika virus testing under Medicare Part B, as long as the clinical diagnostic laboratory test is reasonable and necessary for the diagnosis or treatment of a person's illness or injury.
