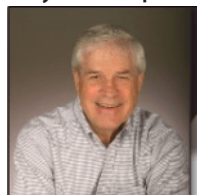

Keynote Speaker: Val Farmer



Dr. Val Farmer is a well-known clinical psychologist and syndicated columnist, specializing in rural mental health and family relationships. His professional background includes a PhD in Clinical Psychology from the University of Arizona in 1976 and thirty-one years of counseling experience in North and South Dakota. Besides his work with marital relationships and rural mental health issues, Dr. Farmer has developed mediation and conflict resolution consultation services to family businesses, particularly farm and ranch families in business together. Dr. Farmer published a syndicated weekly newspaper column from 1984 -2012 that was carried numerous newspapers in United States and Canada including Iowa Farmer Today.

Bible Study Leader: Craig Nesson



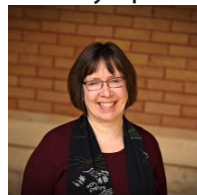
Rev. Dr. Craig Nesson is Academic Dean and Professor of Contextual Theology at Wartburg Theological Seminary in Dubuque, Iowa. He teaches courses in the areas of contextual theology, pastoral theology, and theological ethics. Dr. Nesson has served eleven years as a parish pastor in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania and Cape Girardeau, Missouri. In addition to other articles, reviews, and books, Dr. Nesson is the author of *Shalom Church: The Body of Christ as*

Ministering Community (2010), *Beyond Maintenance to Mission: A Theology of the Congregation* (2010, Revised Edition), and *Transforming Leadership: New Vision for a Church in Mission* (2008—with Norma Cook Everist).

Plenary Speaker: Mary Swander

Mary Swander is the Poet Laureate of the State of Iowa. She has published over thirteen books of poetry and non-fiction, in addition to plays, radio and television scripts and magazine articles. She has appeared in such places as *The New York Times Magazine*, *National Public Radio*, *The New Yorker*, and *Poetry Magazine*. Swander's plays *Driving the Body Back*, *Vang*, and *Farmscape* have toured the U.S. including a performance for Secretary Tom Vilsack and his staff at the U.S.D.A. Swander lives and raises most of her own food on a small acreage in the Amish settlement near Kalona, Iowa. She has experienced three generations of land transition within her own family.

Jean Sullivan has served as co-pastor and teacher at the United Church (UCC/UMC) of Monticello, Iowa since 1999. 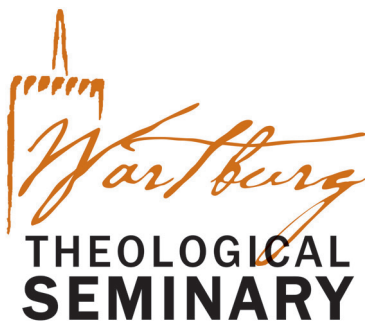
