10:15 A.M. – 11:15 A.M. **Transferring the Risk: Working with the New Insurance and Bonds Exhibit**

Insurance products, markets, and coverage are always evolving. In recognition of this fact, AIA has created an Insurance and Bonds Exhibit to provide contracting parties more flexibility. In this plenary session, panelists will undertake a detailed review of the new exhibit and share practical information that lawyers need to take an active part in negotiating insurance requirements and avoid simply delegating this role to the insurance broker(s). Panelists will discuss common misconceptions about insurance products and coverage that can throw a wrench into negotiations, and they will identify some unattainable (or commercially impractical) insurance requirements that find their way into many otherwise well-drafted contracts.
