History

ASHRAE 2017-2018 Past President's Interview

- 1. What do you like to do in your free time? Having recently retired, I will be spending some time in the garage bringing two four-wheel vehicles and one two-wheeled vehicle back to life.
- 2. Where have you worked in the past? Underwriters Laboratories, LIL-CO, Penske GM Power, Long Island Rail Road, Cashin Spinelli & Ferretti and Nassau Suffolk Engineering & Architecture.
- 3. When and why did you decide to pursue a career in HVAC&R? Unlike many of my predecessors in the Chapter Presidential lineage. I have always been an engineering "generalist", as a result of the broad-based approach during my undergraduate work at Stevens Institute of Technology. The first 13 ½ yeas at the LIRR was spent dealing with the engineering of the rolling stock and, not surprisingly, a critical issue was always customer comfort. As the age of the fleet ranged from 30+ years old to "brand new" the challenge of providing cost effective comfort was a challenge. With the introduction of the "Bi-Level" coach configuration in Diesel Territory, I was involved with the qualification testing (at the manufacturer's Australian Facility) of the rooftop HVAC units, which were a first for the LIRR, and established a new "standard" for the rolling stock. When I retired from the LIRR and went to work for CSF (Surety Consulting) and NSEA (design of municipal facilities) HVAC became an increased segment of my work scope.



Past Chapter President

- What was the year you held the president position in ASHRAE LI? 2016-2017. This occurred a vear earlier than expected due to the relocations of the President-Elect, and coincided with the year our Chapter was hosting the Region I, CRC.
- 5. When/Why did you decide to join the board? After having served as Chairman of the Reception Committee during 2010-2011, I entered the BOG "progression" for the 2011-2012 ASHRAE "season". Concurrently, I chaired the CTTC from 2011/12 – 2015 /16 while progressing through Secretary, Treasurer, Financial Secretary positions.
- 6. What do you feel was the greatest contribution you made in ASHRAE? It would be hard to single out one contribution...As CTTC chair, I attempted to introduce "Technology Lite" to the Sounder, to pique our members curiosity to pursue additional reading/research; As Chapter Treasurer improved fiduciary protocols were followed to ensure compliance with NYS requirements; In conjunction with our program chairs, acting as liaison with PIE and, when Region I became a Sponsor Organization, Jim Price to facilitate the approval of our technical presentations for continuing education credits; and, finally, as President, made effective use of resources to ensure a successful hosting of the CRC even if it meant deferring participation in other ASHRAE activities.
- 7. How has ASHRAE played a significant role in your career? Having worked in positions where I was the customer, the designer or the consultant to the Surety (when a project had gone "south"), the ASHRAE community has provided a network of individuals expert in their fields available to "pick their brains" as well as to have my brain "picked".
- What recommendation would you make towards students showing interest in HVAC&R? Delve into the history of HVAC/R. Learn the whys of where we are at today, and how we got there. Learn from Dan Holohan's" Dead men".

Refrigeration

Our Refrigeration Committee would like to welcome you back for another year here at the ASHRAE Long Island Chapter. The Refrigeration Committee is a sub-committee of CTTC, and will be working closely with CTTC to develop refrigeration oriented programs and field trips for the chapter year.

Additionally, we will be looking for projects to submit to ASHRAE for the Milton Garland Award:

The award shall be known as the Milton W. Garland Commemorative Refrigeration Award for Project Excellence. Refrigeration shall be defined as any use of mechanical refrigeration machinery for application other than human comfort. In general, this will be for food processing and preservation as well as industrial applications. It could also apply to refrigeration used in manufacturing processes, life



support in extreme environments, recreational facilities, or other non-comfort cooling applications. The award shall be made to both the designer and the owner of a non-comfort cooling refrigeration application that incorporates new technology in a unique manner.

Student Activities

This season, 2017-2018, I will be handling student activities. ASHRAE, intents to reach students as early as possible to be able to encourage the study and engineering education at universities, and promote HVAC&R industry. We will pursue the opportunity of implementing the STEAM BOAT competition on Long Island. Obviously, we will need the help of other committees and volunteers in chapter. Obviously, I will try to reach out our members and seek help for student activities committee. I'd like to give a heads up. Students are important for ASHRAE society.
