We know God is available for fellowship with any of His 7+ billion children, anytime and anywhere. Whether it's God or you who strikes-up a conversation, God will give you His undivided attention during your time together.

It can be tough for us to be that attentive, given we live in a world chockful of distractions. That said, some places seem to radiate God's ambience. Ambience refers to the mood or feeling created by a specific setting. Have you ever noticed our sanctuary feels different during our Carols, Candles, and Communion worship than on a typical Sunday morning? That's ambience.

You may have heard ambience used to describe a fancy restaurant known for soft lighting, tranquil music, and other features that provide a pleasant, soothing experience. But what is God's ambience?

Would you believe there are places all around us teeming with His ambience. You may not be driven or tempted to visit them, but these spots provide an ideal setting where you can be still and get to know God better (Psalm 46:10). They're usually calm and free of distractions, helping you feel at ease to look up, take a deep breathe, and enjoy the warmth of God's presence.

You may have heard such places called Thin Spots, meaning it feels like only a thin divider exists between God from us. When I'm in a Thin Spot, I can sense the safe, warm embrace of the Father's Arms and almost feel His Hand in mine. Having grown-up in the country, Thin Spots were readily available when I was a child. An area under some pine trees in our east pasture was my favorite Thin Spot, as well as a safe haven.


Everyone in our Waukee UMC family is encouraged to be part of the Lunch Bunch.



Those trees provided a simple focal point surrounded by natural beauty. The ambience there was so soothing I could experience God's presence via sight, sound, touch, and smell. (Taste...not so much...but four out of five, ain't bad.)

As our world gets louder, busier, and more demanding, Thin Spots may become rarer and more difficult to find. Have faith. They do still exist. As our hours of daylight dwindle and the landscape fades to grey, basking in God's ambience can help you focus on the (proverbial) light at the end of the tunnel.

Find a Thin Spot where you can feel His presence, and be enveloped by God's warmth and light and positive feelings.

Finding Your Thin Spot...

Your Thin Spot can be anywhere you feel safe, at peace, calm, focused, and relaxed. For starters, you could "retreat" to your bathroom, closet, garage, backyard, or office.. You might also want to test the ambience of a local library and/or park, your office, and vehicle. Who knows? Maybe you can invest your time in a check-out line by focusing on God.

Financial Corner

I wanted to update the congregation on our current budget situation. At the end of August, we were running a deficit of \$26,200. As of the end of September that deficit is now at \$27,500.

Our Finance Team continues to monitor this closely. In addition, none of these numbers reflect giving changes that may have occurred after I spoke about a month ago. The chart below puts this into some context:

DEFICIT	\$ (27,500.00)	\$ (600.00)	\$ 19,000.00

We continue to be optimistic about how 2017 will end. Last year 30% of our total giving for 2016 came in during the final three months. We assume the giving percentage will be about the same this year. If that number holds, we believe the deficit for this year will begin to shrink.

Finance has planned over the years and we do have cash reserves to pay for the deficit and no credit is being used to meet our expenses.

Please prayerfully consider your gifts to our church's operating budget.
