As recorded in Mark 12:30-31 (KJV), Jesus said, "thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind, and with all thy strength: this is the first commandment. And the second is like, namely this, Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself. There is none other commandment greater than these."

Many of the people you and I interact with each day probably aren't yet living the life God planned for them. As I see it, that means they're existing, rather than living. Sharing the Good News with them must surely be the most profound expression of love.

Now assuming you've made your belief in God and His (amazing) Grace known to others, each thought you produce has an impact on how others view Him. So far, I've identified these key similarities:

- 1) Each fulfills/fulfilled their Commanding Officer's orders. Jesus Christ completed the work God had planned for Him, all the way to the Cross. Along the way, He endured relentless temptation, scorn, pain, rejection, and ridicule. American soldiers are often subjected to similar treatment, often by Americans who already enjoy freedoms secured by the blood of fallen soldiers. Other times, it's people around the world who can only dream of those freedoms who are the culprits.
- 2) Neither Jesus nor an American soldier knew/knows most of the people they're committed to saving.

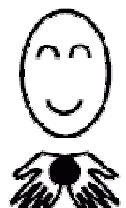
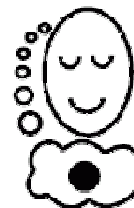

3) No one is forced to accept the gift of freedom provided by Jesus' Death and Resurrection or by an American soldier. Jesus gave, and soldiers give, people the opportunity to live...even to thrive...rather than simply exist. Those who do accept their priceless gift, aren't required to express their gratitude, let alone pay-it-forward by telling others how their freedom was gained.

But by golly: can you imagine the joy in Heaven when someone says, "Thank-you for giving me life," and resolves to make the most of their freedom by glorifying God and loving their neighbor as themselves?
