Q: What's Your Raison D'être?

A: We'll get there, but first some background:

- Jan. 30 is my Stroke Anniversary. It's now been 17 years since a stroke **almost** killed me, but ended up saving my life.
- The sole reason I took French in high school was to meet Iowa State's foreign language requirement for new students. Graduating high school at midterm left me one semester short so I had to take a year of French at ISU. With 4½ years of French under-my-belt, I'd still be at a loss to ask simple questions such as, "Where's the bathroom?" in French.

One phrase, however, has always stuck with me: *raison d'être*. This beautiful French phrase has no equal in English. Translated literally it means, "reason for being." Most of us would probably resort to calling this the meaning (or purpose) of life. Many brilliant minds have pondered, "What is the meaning of life?" not to mention countless not-so-brilliant ones who've bandied it about over various beverages...

Far too many people die before realizing why they ever existed. These folks often trudge through life scrambling to find fulfillment by garnering more money, more fame, more success, more knowledge, more fun, more power, and/or more stuff.

Thank God (seriously) He provided the opportunity for me to find the answer to this question. Somehow, the time and quietness provided by my stroke, and ongoing recovery, prompted a 180° shift in my perspective. It was the afternoon of May 30, 2006, when He brought some verses of Scripture to my mind, arranged in a way that suddenly struck a chord with me. **cont page 2**

February – The Month of Love

We know God is love, and that love is a many-splendored thing. Even early translations of the Bible refer to different types of love.

Agape is the Greek word describing the highest form of love. God has Agape Love for each person and each person should have Agape Love for Him. Unlike other types of love (see below), Agape Love is universal, unconditional, and obliging -- regardless of the circumstances.

Phileo Love ~ Philadelphia, PA, the City of Brotherly Love, is named for this type of love. Friends often feel this type of love for one another. It may also exist among siblings and other family members but is most often associated with deep, abiding friendship that exists by choice, rather than birth.

Ideally, members of a church family will have Phileo Love for one another.

Talk about your major **DUH** moment. Suddenly, I realized life isn't about me. My life is God-given, including my time, talents, and treasures (T³). In gratitude, I should invest my T³ in glorifying God and sharing His Good News with others. That's my *raison d'être*. Call me crazy, but I believe that's the meaning of life for each person God created.

Does this mean we should each sell everything we own and live like paupers? That's not the inkling I've gotten. Based on my conversations with the Big Guy, I believe He expects each of us to meet our own needs so we can better focus on our Marching Orders. Those are recorded in Mark 12:30-31, in what I think of as Jesus' Two Commandments.

How does all that relate to our *raison d'être*? After using your T³ to meet earthly needs and responsibilities, prayerfully invest what's left to glorify God and share His Love with others. That's how you glorify God and edify others. As an added bonus, realizing your *raison d'être* provides fulfillment. You can never accumulate enough of the stuff in the box shown earlier.






Eros Love ~ This type of love is about sex; note eros is the root word for erotic. You won't find this word in the New Testament but there's nothing sinful about Eros Love, when expressed within the confines of marriage.

Storge Love ~ You may not be familiar with this type of love, but have probably experienced it. This is the strong, empathetic love among siblings and other close family members. It may describe the love between a parent and child, among siblings, or among other close family members (aunt, uncle, grandparent, cousins, etc.). Most people around the world have this type of love within their family relationships.

Agape Love ~ This Greek word represents the ultimate type of love. Agape Love is much stronger than Phileo, Eros, or Storge Love. It's also the most self-sacrificing type. Agape Love is what God has for His children. This is the type of love Jesus Christ displayed on the Cross.

Consider John 3:16, which says God loved the world so much He gave His only Son to die in our place so that whoever believes in Him would not perish but have everlasting life.

Agape Love is always associated with the Love of God and rarely occurs in a relationship between two people. The word agape was rarely used in Greek-speaking societies but appears more than 300 times in the New Testament. In addition to John 3:16, consider the following verses:

I John 4:8 ~ Romans 5:5 ~ John 10:17 ~ II Peter 1:17 ~ John 21:20 ~ Romans 5:10

The final verse listed above says, "For if, when we were enemies, we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, much more, being reconciled, we shall be saved by his life."

Jesus Christ, the Son of God, died for His enemies, us, while we were still sinners. That's not something the average human does; Agape Love is a God thing. God loved us first and took the initiative to restore fellowship between Himself and us.
