

Read: Psalm 84

"How lovely is your dwelling place O Lord of hosts."

Psalm 84:1 The Message

Just today, October 23rd, I awoke at 5:30 a.m. to take on my day. This was about two hours before sunrise. I went out on the balcony porch in the darkness, settling into my lounge chair with coffee, Maddie, our lab, devotional, smart phone, and pen, to enjoy my quiet time with the Lord in my dwelling place.



I opened up Facebook (not normally the first thing) and immediately saw a post at the top of the list about Dr. Eugene Peterson, passing away. Eugene Peterson, pastor, professor, Hebrew and Greek language scholar is the author of the Bible paraphrase, The Message. I had heard that Dr. Peterson was having health issues and even though he was in his early 80s, he continued to anoint his audience with God's grace, love and joy. In fact those were the characteristics that permeated his other written works, interviews, and even discussions with U2 band lead singer, Bono. Listening to him was as if you sat at the feet of Jesus.

After reading a brief biography (obituary) from Christianity Today, remembering not only The Message but a few books (not finished with his library yet) I read, that he authored, I started my devotional time with a sense of awe, gratitude, hope and joy. I opened my Celtic Daily Prayer book and began my liturgy of the Daily Office Morning Prayer. I decided I would read my scripture selections for that day from The Message translation in honor of this saint. Listen to what I read in Psalm 84:1-4:

How lovely is your dwelling place, O LORD of hosts!
2 My soul longs, indeed it faints for the courts of the LORD;
my heart and my flesh sing for joy to the living God.
3 Even the sparrow finds a home, and the swallow a nest for herself,
where she may lay her young, at your altars, O LORD of hosts,
my King and my God.
4 Happy are those who live in your house, ever singing your praise. *Selah*

Peterson, like Paul, would count it all joy. Even to his dying moments he expressed joy that his soul was leaving his physical dwelling place and abiding in his heavenly dwelling place with Christ for eternity. As witnessed by family in Christianity Today, "Among his final words were, 'Let's go.' And his joy: my, oh my; the man remained joyful right up to his blessed end, smiling frequently. In such moments it's best for all mortal flesh to keep silence. But if you have to say something say this: 'Holy, Holy, Holy.'"

Life was not perfect for Dr. Peterson, but he chose joy because in my opinion he lived and lives in God's dwelling of what I coming to understand as Hope, Victory, Confidence and Love, and Peterson shared the same with me and the multitude. I wished I had met him face to face, but I had and have the privilege to meet him in his thirty books and The Message translation in the meantime. Thank you, Dr. Peterson.

Prayer: O Lord you are my dwelling place and help me to grasp and live your hope, your victory, your confidence, and your love in and through my life. Yes, you are my dwelling place. All praise to you!!! Amen.

IRA Charitable Rollover Made Permanent

Another Way to Give to the Church

Congress has made permanent the opportunity to make a charitable gift from an IRA plan. If you are 70 1/2 or older, you can make a direct transfer from your IRA account to First United Church – tax free!

How it works:

- The gift must be transferred directly from your IRA account to First United Methodist Church, Irving.
- You must be at least 70 1/2 years old.
- You can transfer up to \$100,000 per year.
- If you haven't already taken your required minimum distribution in a given year, a qualifying rollover can count towards meeting this requirement.
- Distributions from 401 (k) and 403 (b) accounts or other employer-sponsored retirement plans do not qualify.
- Your IRA transfer generates neither taxable income nor a tax deduction, so you benefit even if you don't itemize your taxes.


