I grew up around mass transit in the southeastern part of Pennsylvania. It was easy and relaxing to travel to Philadelphia to see a sports event (never attended an Eagles game), tour the historic area, or go shopping with my mother and dad during the Christmas season. IRA Charitable Rollover Made Permanent
Another Way to Give to the Church
Congress has made permanent the opportunity to make a charitable gift from an IRA plan. If you are 70 ½ or older, you can make a direct transfer from your IRA account to First United Church – tax free!
How it works:

- The gift must be transferred directly from your IRA account to First United Methodist Church, Irving.
- You must be at least 70 ½ years old.
- You can transfer up to \$100,000 per year.
- If you haven’t already taken your required minimum distribution in a given year, a qualifying rollover can count towards meeting this requirement.
- Distributions from 401 (k) and 403 (b) accounts or other employer-sponsored retirement plans do not qualify.
- Your IRA transfer generates neither taxable income nor a tax deduction, so you benefit even if you don’t itemize your taxes.

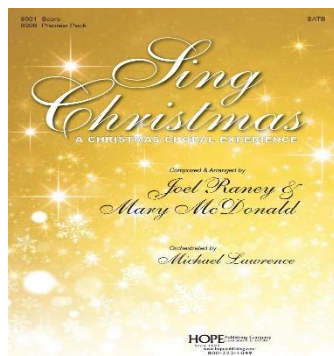
