Plenary Speakers

Nicole Fantin - BAH, MA, DTATI© has been working with Hospice Wellington for the past five years focused on program development, spear-heading as a student intern the evolution of the permanent Art Therapy program currently operating at a full-time capacity. Hired on in April 2013, Nicole has offered private individual and group programming supporting the grief and bereavement population throughout Wellington County, working with children, adolescent and adults towards emotional well-being and collective growth. She had also offered group programming to professional and volunteer caregivers, focusing on the fundamentals of balanced self-care practices while discussing the potentials of vicarious trauma and compassion fatigue. Nicole has partnered with several organizations including Child and Family Services, supporting community interventions focused on adopting alternative coping strategies while dealing with trauma and community crisis. Nicole has been recognized as one of Southern Ontario’s Top 40 under 40 in 2014-15 for her personal and professional contributions to vibrant communities in Canada.

Catherine Fife - For the past decade, Catherine worked tirelessly on behalf of the families of Kitchener-Waterloo to help improve the quality and their access to education. She was a three-term trustee and Chair of the Waterloo Region District School Board, Vice President of the Canadian School Boards’ Association, and President of the Ontario Public School Boards’ Association. Catherine has also served as a member of the Education Alliance for a Sustainable Ontario. Before that, Catherine was a research co-ordinator for the Partnerships for Children and Families project at Wilfrid Laurier University, she was active with the Child Family Journal (Kidslink), and was a member of the Political Action Committee of the Canadian Federation of University Women. In 2012, Catherine was elected as the Member of Provincial Parliament for the riding of Kitchener—Waterloo, where she became the first New Democrat to win a seat in the City of Waterloo. Catherine is currently the NDP critic for Finance and the Treasury Board.
