From the Pastor's desk.....

Chris Lynch, conference youth specialist, worked with parents and congregational members a couple of Sundays ago in an informative and thought-provoking discussion about the future of youth ministry here at Cayce. We get caught up in the activity of youth programming that we often forget the "why" of it. We start with the why (the qualities and the hallmarks) and do those things that will insure that we achieve those things.

MISSIONS R US.

The ladies of SCCUMW are very active in their mission efforts across the Conference and beyond. Several years ago, in this space, I addressed how we can be in mission, helping folks far and wide. Some of the information has changed, some has remained the same, while other opportunities have been added, making it necessary to update and inform you of ways you can help others.

Gift Cards All five mission projects can use gift cards. If you are giving a card good at a particular grocery store or office supply store, make sure that there is one close to that mission. Overall, Wal-Mart gift cards can be used by just about any of our projects. Please put the amount on the card.

New Postage Stamps All five mission projects in our Conference can use new stamps for mailings that go out all during the year. If you buy 100 stamps, each project will receive 20 of them.

Killingsworth has sent out an email with an additional way we can help these ladies. If you have a Kroger near you, sign up for their community rewards program. Go online to <https://www.kroger.com/communityrewards> and fill out the form. Killingsworth's number is **89702**. You will be asked for this number as you sign up.

Campbell Soup labels Wallace Family Life and Bethlehem Center, Spartanburg both have been collecting soup labels. I know that I told you the program had been discontinued. That has changed—again. This program has been changed somewhat. They are still accepting labels. The part that needs to be saved is the “labels for education” section and UPC code from the label. This is usually right at the seam and where the label is glued to the can, so be careful. Make sure that “Labels for Education” is printed on the UPC code and is included with the bars and numbers when you cut it off the can.

Box tops for Education You can find an elementary school close to you that might want these box tops. If not, I will collect them and take them to a school near me. As you begin the new year of filling out your Mission Today Action form, collecting Box Tops and taking them to an elementary school will qualify for the Campaign for Children slot.

Pull Tabs from Soda Cans, adult beverage cans and aluminum cans. I will take these to the Ronald McDonald House in Greenville. Colored pull tabs are used to make bracelets that sell for \$8, the price of a room for a family for one night. (If a family cannot afford \$8, they use the proceeds from bracelets to fund their room.)

Cancelled Stamps for Marion Mission Storehouse By now we all know of the stamps that need to be trimmed, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ inch border around it, and sent to this storehouse to be sold for profits used to send shoes, clothes, and medical supplies to Methodist Churches in Zambia and Republic of the Congo.

So you see, everyone can be involved in mission work. Our five mission projects need us. Other folks near and far need us. We can be the hands and feet of God as we work together to make our world better for women, children and youth.
