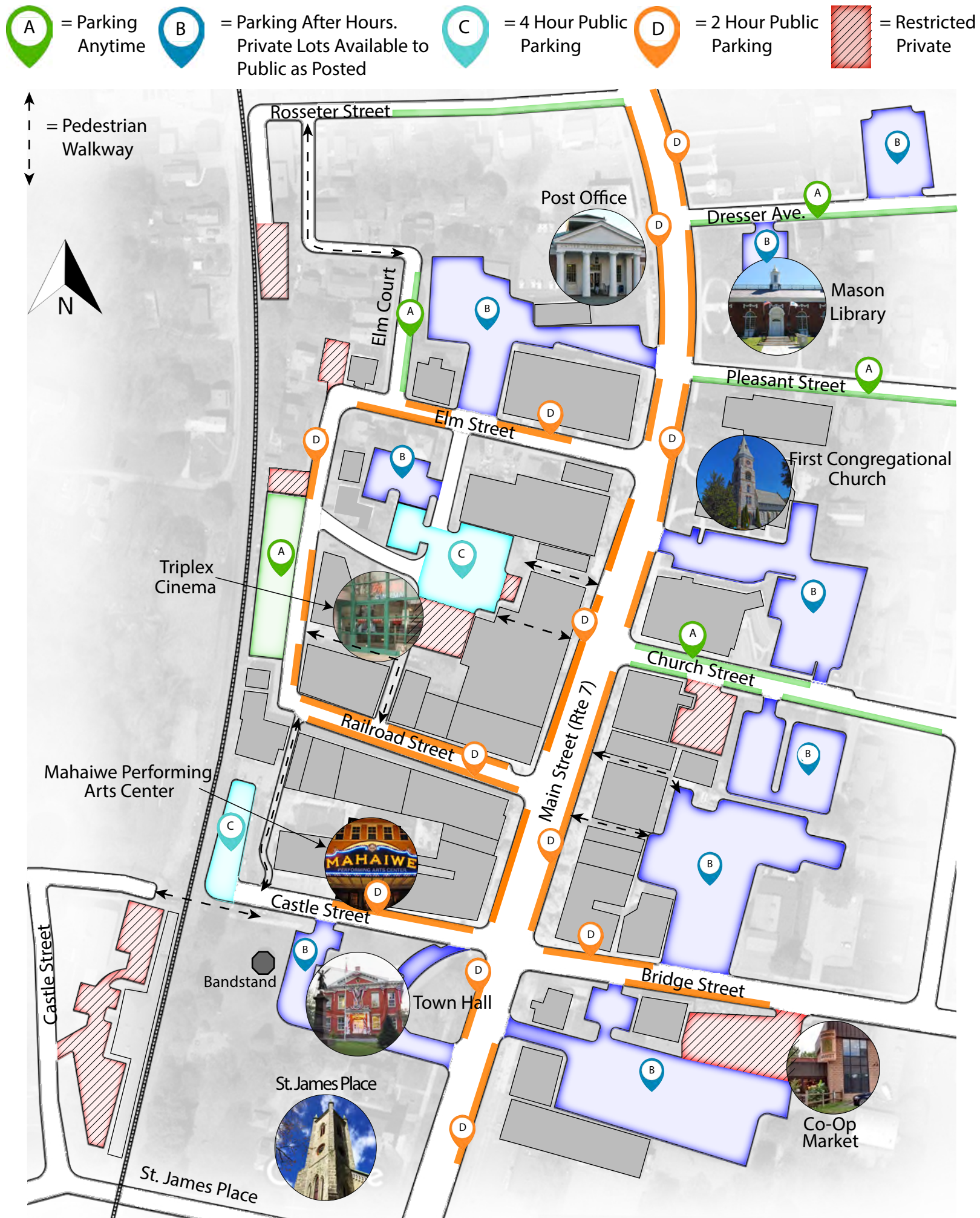


Downtown Great Barrington Public Parking Guide



PARKING GUIDE

Downtown Great Barrington

Welcome to Great Barrington! Downtown is the cultural and commercial hub of the region, offering diverse shopping, dining, and attractions. Whether you're here for a day or the evening, or several, we know you'll find anything you need.

Remember, almost everything downtown is nearby—nothing is more than a 5-minute walk. Check out the map on the reverse side. **Park once, walk everywhere!**

There are almost 1,000 total parking spaces, and parking is free! On-street parking and parking lots are regulated however, and the rules are actively enforced. Here's what you need to know:

A Unlimited parking: You can park in these spaces, for free, for as long as you want. A few Town lots and some on-street parking, shown on the map, is unlimited.

B After-hours parking lots: Many downtown businesses make their parking lots available for public use after normal weekday business hours, such as after 5pm, and on weekends. Please check the signs for specific time/day restrictions.

C Public lots, some restrictions: A few public lots that are in high demand have 4-hour maximums during the weekdays, but are unlimited overnight and on weekends.

D On-street restrictions: For the most part, on-street parking is limited to two hours during the height of the shopping day, for example between 9am and 6pm. Some streets do not have time restrictions. Outside of those hours, you can park as long as you want. Be sure to check the signs, and of course please leave the handicapped spaces for those who need them. (Oh, and if it snows overnight, on-street parking is prohibited.)

Events: On Saturday mornings between mid-May and the end of October, the Great Barrington **Farmer's Market** is held in the parking lot at 18 Church Street. If you're going to see a show at the **Mahaiwe Performing Arts Center**, **St. James Place**, or the **TriPlex**, you should be able to find plenty of parking, especially after the business day. **ENJOY! More Resources and Things to do: **Public restrooms** are located at the Mason Library, Town Hall, and the Chamber of Commerce Visitors Booth. The farmer's market has one, too, when they're in session. Check out the **Southern Berkshire Chamber of Commerce** visitors booth at the corner of Main and St. James Place (<http://southernberkshirechamber.com/>). The Historical Commission has a great **Downtown Historic Walking Tour Map**, and app for your mobile device. Pick up the map at Town Hall or [download the app](#) from your app store. Kids can check out the **park and playground** behind Town Hall, where **concerts** are held in the bandstand on Saturday mornings. Friday evening concerts include live jazz and local hits. And, be sure to visit the **Housatonic River Walk**, for beautiful scenery and fascinating history (www.gbriverwalk.org).
