## My Daily Offering



### RABBI NOLAN LEBOVITZ

Last winter I was invited to join the Jewish Federation's Edah Fellowship for Rabbis to develop vital skills related to congregational innovation and organizational change.

Our teacher for most sessions has been Abby Fifer Mandell, the Executive Director of the Brittingham Social Enterprise Lab and an Adjunct Professor of Entrepreneurship at the USC Marshall School of Business. She teaches us primarily about "design thinking."

As opposed to traditional innovation, in which the entrepreneur thinks of a product and brings it to market, **design thinking demands that an entrepreneur study his or her intended users and design solutions to address their needs.**

### SO WHAT ARE OUR NEEDS?

I interviewed approximately fifteen members of our community asking to describe their day for me. I interviewed a range of people – women and men, working and retired, ages ranged across the board – and I immediately noticed trends, similarities. All of us wake up really early and go to bed late, many of us use the word "exhausting" to describe our routines. Each member I interviewed is over-scheduled, over-programmed, and able to explain to me her or his entire day within precise fifteen or thirty minute blocks of time.

At the end of each description, I'd ask a simple question: **If you could add one or two more activities in your day, without addressing the issue of time, if you could add time to do anything what would it be?** Each person – each one – expressed a desire to spend more

time with friends and family, and each one expressed a desire to read more or learn more, for greater intellectual stimulation during the day. At this point, I am unfortunately not sure how to facilitate more time with family and friends during the day, but I do know how to use technology to help with our learning.

**This year, I will be launching a podcast called My Daily Offering.**

The podcast will be a 2-5 minute inspirational teaching of Torah that is meant to make your day more meaningful.

I hope this new technology helps bring more learning and inspiration into our community. With this podcast, you can carry around a few minutes of Torah learning with you in your pockets. And when you listen to it, at home in the morning or at work on a break, know that others are listening all across the city. For we are a community both dedicated to the incredible wisdom of our Jewish heritage and also dedicated to our cell phones.
