That business was a success, but after four years, rent increases forced her to choose between relocating or closing, so she chose to shutter the shop and take a new job.

By this time, residing in the far East Valley, she found work in Activities with a resort in Gold Canyon. That job worked out well, in large part because Sharon grew close to her boss. Then, after a year and a half, management decided to fire the boss and Sharon chose to quit. After all, she had a new granddaughter she wanted to help with.

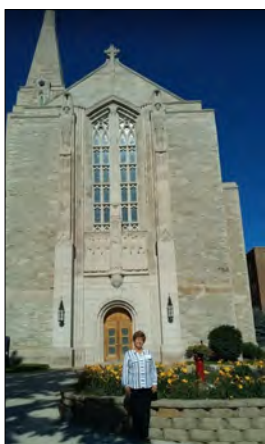

### **The Julie Lee Band Tuesday, November 14th**



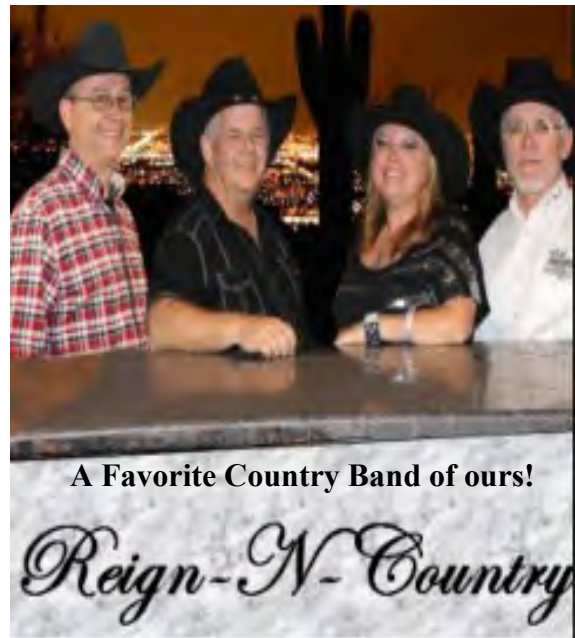

Following dinner Mesa City Band will play a medley of patriotic music.

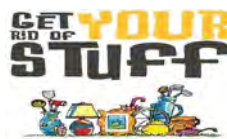
## November Breakfasts

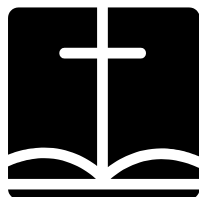

### AN IMPORTANT NOTE FROM THE MAIL ROOM

Welcome back everyone! I hope you had a great summer and are looking forward to a super winter.

Hopefully everyone did a change of address with your local post office back at home. If you did, please allow ample time for your mail to start being delivered on a regular basis. Remember we are only 1 park of the thousands in AZ, so the mail volume is huge and it will be slow at first. If you did not do a forwarding order, *please* do so. It will help get your mail here.

**JUST A FEW REMINDERS:** Make sure you let the office know that you have returned so they can let me know you are here. Otherwise your mail will continue to be forwarded back home.

\*When the mail is **COMPLETED** for the day, a day of the week tag is posted on the mailroom door. So if you get your mail **BEFORE** that tag goes up and are expecting a package or meds, stop back as it might be in a locker. I **SORT** all mail 1<sup>st</sup>, then place in the boxes and then do packages last. Please do not ask me to look for yours if you get there early. This slows me down and I'm sure yours is just as important as someone else. Also **PLEASE CHECK** your mail **BEFORE OPENING** it. Make sure it has your name on it. Sometimes pieces can stick together and it gets placed in the wrong box. If you should receive something that isn't yours, please drop it in the **IN PARK BOX**, located on the **NORTH** side of the mailroom so it can be delivered to the rightful owner. The box located by the mail room door is for **OUTGOING MAIL ONLY!**

\*If you have noticed on some of your mail I have stamped in black "**CORRECT LOT NUMBER PLEASE**". It's because you need to contact the sender and have your correct lot # added. When you have moved within in the park or are new to the park, it makes sorting the mail faster and easier than having to stop and take the time to look it up. It helps me and my wonderful volunteers which I have from time to time. For those of you that are going to receive medicine or packages **PLEASE** stress to the sender that your **LOT #** needs to be included, very important.

\*Also, when you have grandchildren or relatives writing to you, sending cards, etc **PLEASE** make sure that they include your **LAST NAME** and **LOT #**. We have so many Grampa & Gramma's in the park and with no last name or lot # you might not get it. And there are also duplicate last names which makes the **LOT #** very important.

\*When placing mail in the **OUTGOING BOX**, please make sure you have the proper postage on it and your return address. When placing anything in the **IN PARK BOX** to be distributed within the park, make sure they are in numerical order and rubber band or paper clipped if more than 5 pieces. If not they will not be places in the mail boxes.
