71% Firewall, 63% VPN, and 58% Encryption







65% of all respondents believe that their organization is required to appoint a Data Protection Officer

DO YOU NEED A COMPLIANCE PLAN? KEY QUESTIONS TO ASK

- Does my company have a presence in an EU country?
- Is my organization processing personal data from European residents?
- Is my data unencrypted at any stage?

- Is my data unable to be deleted or transferred at customer request?
- Am I using 3rd parties to process personal information?
- Is personal data on EU citizens processed or stored outside of the EU?

If you answered yes to any of these questions, it's time to start working towards GDPR Compliance.

Any organization, including those selling B2B and B2C, that processes personal data from a natural EU citizen must comply.
