Fellow North Jersey Branch Members,





## Mantoloking Beach Erosion and Remediation After Superstorm Sandy

On November 3, COPRI hosted a pair of presentations on Mantoloking Beach erosion events and the remediation and protection of the beach using a steel sheet pile wall. Dr. Stewart Farrell of the Coastal Research Center at Stockton University presented on the coastal erosional and natural depositional processes on a sand-based shoreline particularly at the Mantoloking Beach, and what forces and events shape the beach/dune system. Mr. Mainberger of Mott MacDonald presented the temporary measures used for shoreline protection at Mantoloking as well as the dune restoration project sponsored by the NJDEP, Borough of Mantoloking, and The Township of Brick that includes a 45-foot-deep buried steel sheet pile wall at the core. Nearly 60 people attended these lectures that offered them 2.0 PDHs accredited for New York State and New Jersey.

## "Behavior, Structural Design, and Applications of Ductile Cementitious Materials"

Ductile cementitious materials are a class of cement-based materials that exhibit a pseudo strain-hardening behavior in uniaxial tension after first cracking, and retain residual strength in compression after crushing. The unique mechanical properties of these materials have led researchers and designers to investigate and design structural components where damage tolerance and enhanced structural performance is needed.

This presentation will discuss:

- The material behavior of ductile cementitious materials
- Applications of ductile cementitious in structural members
- Methods for designing structural components with these materials
- Computational tools that can predict the behavior of components utilizing ductile cementitious materials.
