



On Street Parking Guidelines

To our neighbors in DeLand:

Parking enforcement is one of the many responsibilities handled by your police department. Your community homeowners association may also have parking rules and regulations which are part of the covenants of your community. The DeLand Police Department appreciates the voluntary compliance with these various rules and regulations.

We look to the citizens of our community to observe and comply with all parking laws. At this time, the parking infractions in your neighborhood generally do not warrant a full scale enforcement effort. If however, parking infractions should escalate such that they interfere with emergency access, use of sidewalks, crosswalks or driveways, or access to fire hydrants, the police department will become more proactive with fineable parking citations. Most fines are \$116 for each offense and the vehicle could also be subject to tow and storage fees. The most commonly violated parking rules are those outlined below and are illustrated on the back of this page:

- 1. Parking which blocks a fire hydrant No parking is allowed within 15 feet of a fire hydrant.
- 2. Parking opposite to the flow of traffic (left wheels to the curb).
- 3. Parking on or blocking a sidewalk or bike path.
- 4. Parking in front of or within 5 feet of a driveway.
- 5. Parking within 20 feet of an intersection/intersecting roadway or on a cross walk.
- 6. Parking within 30 feet upon the approach to any flashing signal, stop sign, or traffic control signal located at the side of a roadway.
- 7. Parking on opposite sides of a street such that there is insufficient room for emergency vehicles, garbage and service trucks or other vehicles to freely pass minimum 25 foot separation.
- 8. Parking in violation of an official sign.
