Finally, it's Fall! Many people enjoy this season and spend more time outdoors as the temperature starts to cool down. I'd like to take this opportunity to remind our residents about the local wildlife in the area and how important it is to not feed or disturb them. The Sandhill Cranes are a threatened species, in fact there is a company that comes into Victoria Park to monitor and count them. Feeding them is against the law; doing so draws them out of their natural habitat, making them less afraid of humans, and more susceptible to cars. Please keep your pets on a leash at all times while out in the neighborhood, dogs and cats alike have been known to chase after other animals. As we head into the winter months more cranes will be migrating into the area along with other species such as the Florida Black bear as they prepare for "denning" as this southern breed of Black bear do not truly hibernate as Northern species of bear do.
