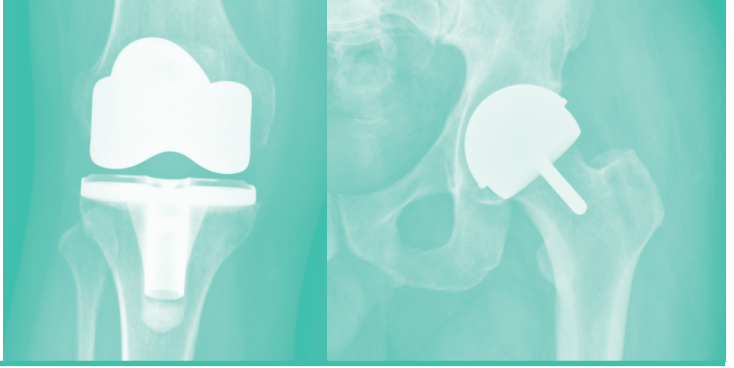

STATEMENT OF NEED

As the volume of total joint arthroplasty increases worldwide, the population undergoing these procedures is ever younger. This is no longer the world of continuous passive motion (CPM), extended rehab stays, and return to walking as the desired outcome. As a result, clinicians are seeking up-to-date guidelines in order to optimally treat their clients. This course will provide insight into surgical options, as well as an evidence based approach to the post-operative rehabilitation of this demographic from expert surgeons and rehabilitation professionals of Hospital for Special Surgery (HSS).

TARGET AUDIENCE

This activity is targeted to physical therapists and physical therapist assistants.
