About our speaker

Daniel Shapiro served as the U.S. Ambassador to Israel from July 2011 until the end of the Obama Administration. As ambassador, Shapiro won praise from leaders of both countries for his deft management of the U.S.-Israel relationship during widespread regional instability and periods of significant bilateral tension and disagreement. Among Shapiro's major contributions were negotiating the \$38 billion Memorandum of Understanding for U.S. military aid to Israel, overseeing 40 percent growth in U.S.-Israel trade, and unprecedented public outreach in fluent Hebrew to Israel's diverse communities.

Shapiro's term as ambassador followed a notable career of over 20 years in senior foreign policy and national security positions in the U.S. government, including as the Senior Director for the Middle East and North Africa at the National Security Council. Currently, Shapiro is the Distinguished Visiting Fellow at Tel Aviv University's Institute of National Security Studies, a highly respected think tank that shapes the public discourse of issues on Israel's national security agenda.
