North Iowans are developing a new strategic plan for economic development. The first phase of the Vision North Iowa plan includes gathering comments and suggestions from as many people as possible.

Local coffee shops and breweries will be giving a discount on purchases to people who complete the survey.

“The deadline to finish the survey is almost here,” said Chad Schreck, President and CEO of the North Iowa Corridor Economic Development Corporation (NIEDC). “We wanted to make a special effort to get everyone involved and to have a little fun at the same time.”
