## **Sholosh Seudot “You Gotta be Kiddin’ Me” Halacha Discussion**

Once there was a shul in which the various honours and *aliyos* were auctioned off to the highest bidder. It was Parsha Toldos, and the congregants prepared for a bidding war over the sixth aliyah, in which Yitzchak Avinu blesses Yaakov, “May Hashem grant you from the dew of the heavens and the fatness of the earth.” People wanted to be called up for this berachah and were willing to pay a high price for it.

The bidding began and quickly proceeded, with several bidders raising the price from fifty dollars to a hundred, then two, three and four hundred dollars. When it hit that price, most bidders backed down. The price war was left to two competitors, one of whom Shimon, a wealthy businessman, and the other was none other than a voice from the women’s section.

The price continued to rise until finally, when it reached a thousand dollars, Shimon had enough of the contest. He signaled the Gabbai to spike the price up to \$1500. There was silence from the women’s section. “Going once, going twice, sold for \$1500!” called the gabbai, and Shimon won the aliyah.

After davening, he went home with a smile of satisfaction. “Did someone honour you with an aliyah?” his wife asked him when he got home.

“I honoured myself,” he said. “I spent \$1500 for that aliyah, after a price war with some lady from the women’s section.”

“That was no lady. That was me,” answered his wife. It turned out that the two competitors were none other than a husband and his own wife. She had been embarrassed to call out from the women’s section herself, so she asked her friend to do it for her. Otherwise, he would have recognized her voice and stopped bidding.

Afterwards, the husband asked if he was really obligated to pay the full \$1500 at which the bidding finished. His bid for \$1500 was based on mistaken presumption that someone else was bidding against him. Had they known that they were both bidding on his behalf, they could have finished the bidding at \$400, where the last competitor dropped off.


