Sholosh Seudot “You Gotta be Kiddin’ Me” Halacha Discussion

One Shabbos afternoon, Reuven walked down the street and was amazed to find a hundred dollar bill on the sidewalk. Since money is muktzeh on Shabbos, he could not pick up the bill. Nonetheless, he was unwilling to let this prize slip out of his hands. Instead, he placed his foot over the bill and waited for Shabbos to end so that he could pick it up.

As he stood there, a local pauper approached him and said, “Excuse me, sir. I know what you have under your foot. It’s a hundred dollar bill. But let me just tell you that I saw it first. I saw it this morning, but I could not spend the entire Shabbos waiting in one place, so I decided to leave and come back later to get it. If you take it, you’ll be committing a sin.”

“You cannot claim possession of something you find just by looking at it,” answered Reuven, quoting a well-known Gemara (Bava Metzia 2b). “You did not pick it up yet, so it is not yours. I’m going to wait here until after Shabbos so I can take the hundred dollar bill for myself. If you want, you can come to my house tonight, and I will give you twenty dollars as tzedakah instead.”

Reuven waited there until after Shabbos was over and then bent over to pick up the bill. His grin turned into a frown of consternation when he saw printed in bold red letters on the back of the bill, “Ezra’s Print Shop”: We Print Everything Except Dollars!” It was a fake bill thrown on the ground as a promotional gimmick. He grumbled all the way home in a mood of bitter disappointment. When he reached his front door, he found the pauper waiting for the twenty dollar bill he promised.

“You want the twenty dollars?” I was going to give it to you as a compromise, but now I’ll give you the entire bill we were fighting over,” said Reuven, and he handed the pauper the fake bill.

“No way!” said the pauper. “You said the bill you found was yours, and promised me twenty dollars of tzedakah instead. I don’t care if that bill was real or not. Give me the twenty dollars you promised!”

Profiles

Each week, we profile a different family in a (hopefully) fun and non-invasive manner to help us get to know our fellow shul members. This week we spotlight Ron Mandel.

TCS Editor: You should be ashamed of yourself. On account of last week's profile you got the Treasurer booted off the Board

TCS: Are you kidding me? He is so happy that he taking me out for a steak dinner.

TCS Editor: Not using the Shul funds I trust.

TCS: We will leave that to the new treasurer to figure out.

TCS: We should get started. Ron, you have been a long-time member of TCS but how did you first get connected?

Ron: I went to study in Jerusalem for a month 4 years ago. I took classes with AISH and had one-on-one sessions which provided a meaningful Jewish connection. I frequently got invited for Shabbos meals which provided another avenue for growth.

TCS: What was your initial experience like with TCS?

Ron: It was great. The first time I showed up I was invited by Alex Katz for lunch and everyone seemed so warm.

TCS: What appeals to you about TCS?

Ron: The classes on Shabbat are a highlight. I appreciate someone like Rabbi Spitz whose approach is very interactive. I have a bias against lectures but dialogue and honest exchanges of opinion open the door to growth.

TCS: You have an intriguing business. Would you describe it briefly for us?

Ron: In my opinion of the world, the business community is leading positive change by creating healthy work cultures. It won't happen through political or religious institutions which have their own agendas. We spend a lot of time at work and that is where, in the right environments, we can learn how to be better human beings. The goal in World-leading organizations is to provide the best service or product (and do so) by creating environments where everyone treats each other like menschs.

TCS: How can your approach to business be applied to Shul?

Ron: In business, change is constant and personal growth is a prerequisite to one's future. The same effort is required at Synagogue; the Torah can be used to make personal change but it requires effort beyond praying for change. For that, we need to have the right teachers leading us to ask the right questions so we make the connections to how Judaism speak to me in my life.

TCS: Have you volunteered in any capacity with TCS over the years?

Ron: I have conducted workshops as part of the Young Professionals network.

TCS: Any children?

Ron: I have a son and a daughter and as well as two granddaughters.

TCS: Zaidy Ron?

Ron: Hard to believe but true.

TCS: Your work involves quite a bit of travel. What are some of the locations that you have visited?

Ron: China, SE Asia, India, Europe, Australia, New Zealand and the U.S. Living in China gave me an enormous respect for Chabad. Chabad is everywhere.

TCS: Any cool tales from your travels?

Ron: In Bangkok seeing men with Streimels was surreal. There are lots of Kosher factories such as tuna plants so Israelis come monthly to inspect. Another time I stopped in a little town in Germany and witnessed a display on the side of the City Hall from a class project that traced where Jews from that town ended up.

TCS: How has travel affected your outlook on life?

Ron: It has helped me appreciate what we have in Canada as well as what we don't have. In Canada, we are blessed with a lot more material comforts, privacy and freedom of choice. But in poorer countries there can be much more of a sense of community. And privacy comes at a price. Even though we have more possessions and space we are a lonelier society here and not necessarily happier.

TCS: Do you speak any other languages?

Ron: French and I learned a bit of Yiddish when I was young.

TCS: Do you see yourself doing the same work in 10 years?

Ron: Absolutely. I am now working at building values-based cultures in health care in the U.S. Our goal is to help improve their levels of patient care by reconnecting with the reasons they chose the Health Care profession and to support each other better.

TCS: Where do you see TCS in 10 years?

Ron: I hope to see it as a place where people are growing personally not just halachically. If people are praying more but not feeling more fulfilled personally then it will not be a success.

TCS: Tough question. The house is on fire and you only have time to choose one veggie on your burger. Do you go for lettuce or tomato?

Ron: Tomato.

TCS: That was a bit of a trick question. There is no wrong answer here unless you say that the ketchup takes care of the tomato. But of course you know better than that Ron.

TCS: Something about you that people would never have known?

Ron: I have still a motorcycle and twice drove across the country.

TCS: At the next progressive dinner you have a chance to either be seated with Warren Buffet or Edward Snowden? Who do you choose?

Ron: Warren Buffet. He has donated tons of money and wants to change the world. He is someone who not only wants to make a positive difference, he is doing so.

TCS: Any hobbies or interests?

Ron: I love travelling. It gets me to look at the world differently. It is important to me to travel not as a tourist but as a local.

TCS: Parting thoughts?

Ron: Make it personal. Don't take the idea that something needs to be improved but not be willing to do that yourself.

TCS: Finally, President re-elect Stuart is busy redecorating his oval office this week leaving you as President. What changes can we expect to see?

Ron: I would insist that anyone leading a class be limited to 15 minutes of them speaking and have the remaining time devoted to dialogue.

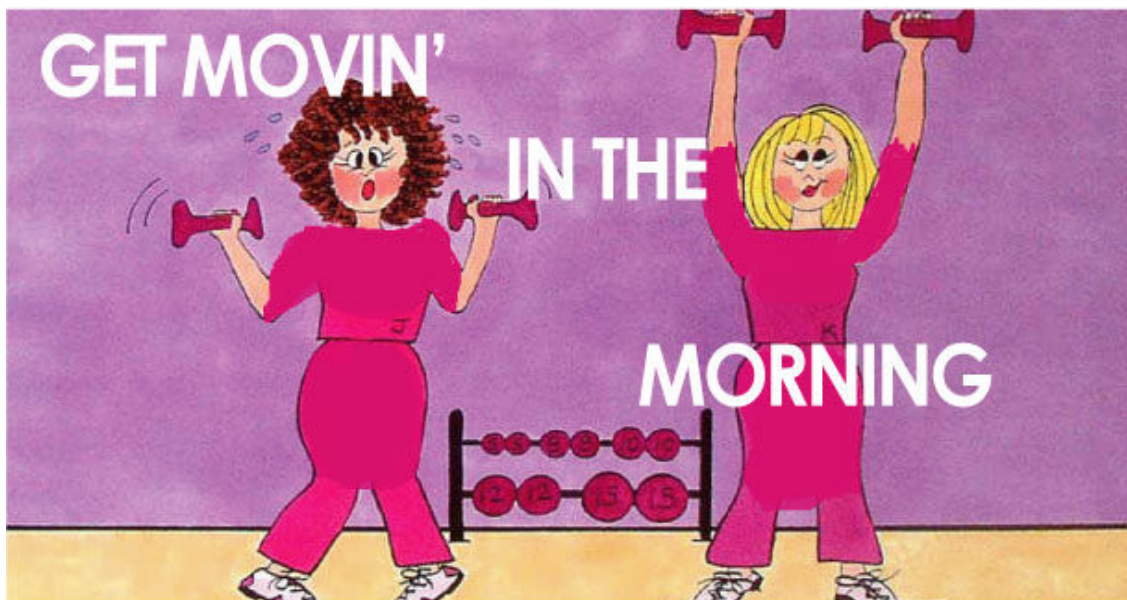

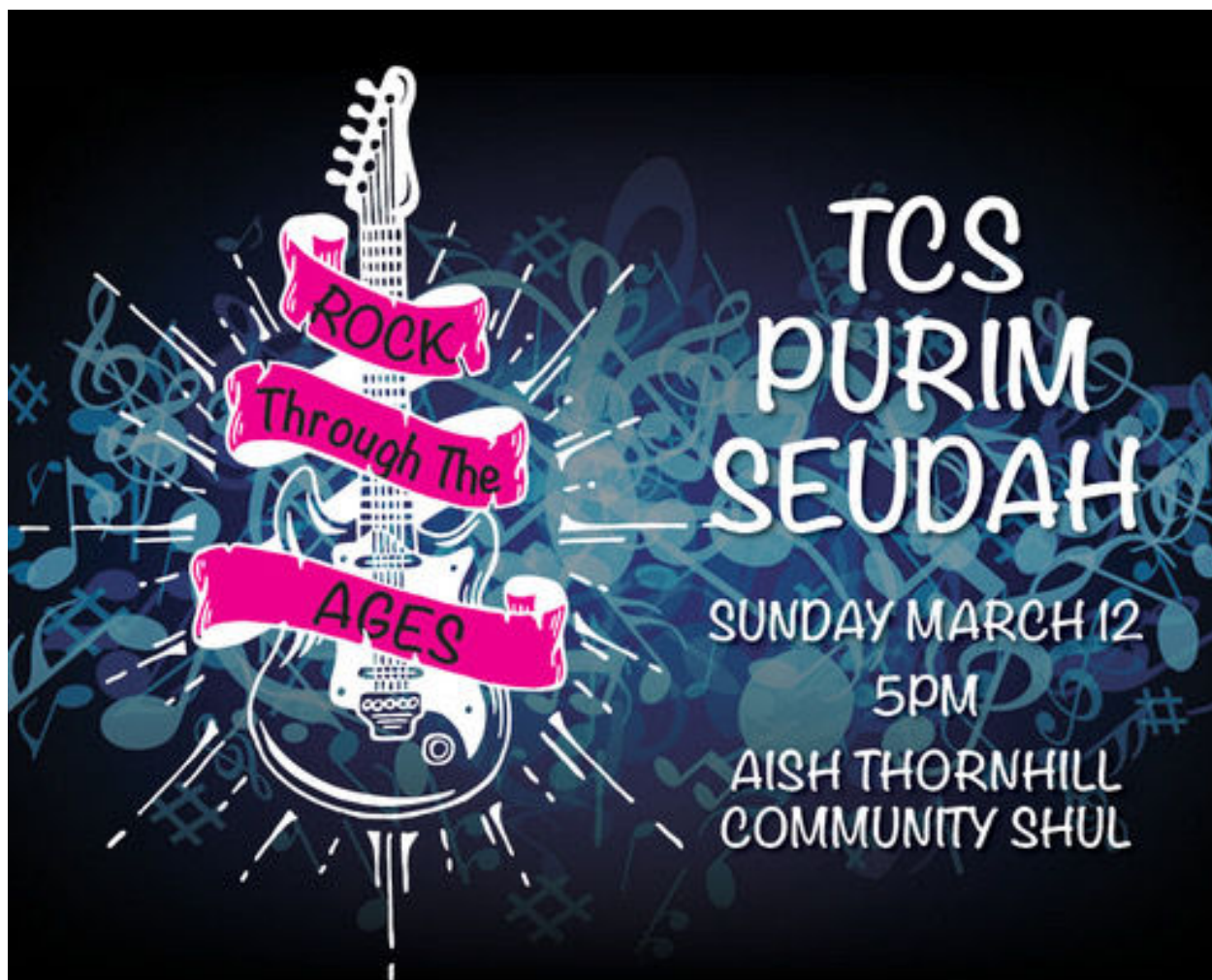
