Profiles

This week we resume our PROFILES feature designed to help us get to know our fellow shul members in a (hopefully) fun and non-invasive manner. This week we feature Irving and Vierka Fink.

Vierka: Where is the TCS Editor?

Vierka: I am not a leader, I am a doer.

Irving: Except at home. She is very much a leader when it comes to me.

Vierka: Irving took over from Rueben Saul and Michael Ironi preparing Seudah Shlishit. But he would not eat or even touch vegetables so I came in to assist him.

TCS: Does Irving set the table and clean up at home like he does at Shul for Seudah Shlishit?

Vierka: I will let him speak for himself on that one.

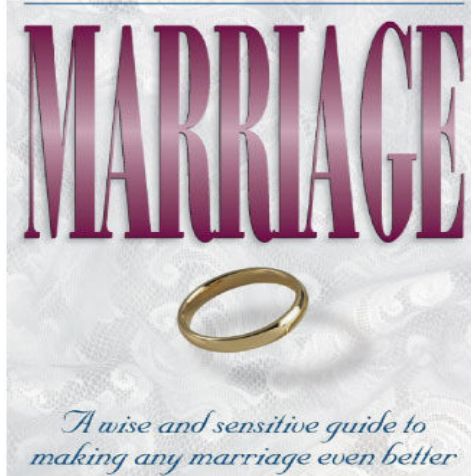
