Sholosh Seudot “You Gotta be Kiddin’ Me” Halacha Discussion

A person who had trouble finding a suitable job, he was offered a position as a Buckingham Palace guard. The job description included working on Shabbos. Receiving money for work done on Shabbos would be permitted in this case, since he would be paid for the entire week at once (*Shulchan Aruch, Orach Chaim 306:4*) Furthermore. The position did not involve any real labor, since he only needed to stand at attention in front of the palace gates. The biggest problem that faced him was the issue of carrying ceremonial swords and there is no eruv around the palace. Is there any room in Halachah to permit this?

Profiles

This week we continue with our 50th edition of PROFILES. This week we spotlight the Chulent Kick-Off and the event creator, organizer and CEO Patti Dolman.

TCS: Let's get started by asking where did the idea come from?

Patti: I heard of other synagogues putting them on. The concept of an event that would entail community effort and engender community spirit really appealed to me.



TCS: What was the tipping point that made you decide to put on a ATCS version?

Patti: Dr. Lieberman, a speaker that really impressed me was coming to the Village Shul, so I made arrangements for Charles and I to stay nearby with my daughter that Shabbat. It just so happened to be the week that they were putting on the chulent cook-off event.

TCS: What did you see?

Patti: 12 chulent pots and an extremely well run event. Charles and I tasted all 12 entries and voted separately only to find out that we agreed upon the best.

TCS: Was there anything in particular that you felt was done very well?

Patti: When Rabbi Sytner singled out all that his wife had done, it really impressed me. The event looked simple on the surface but so much went on behind the scenes. I decided to pattern everything at ATCS from what was done at the Village Shul.

TCS: Can you give an example?

Patti: What do people do when they are leaving and forget to vote? They leave tickets with nearest chulent pot creating a bias in the voting so we have to watch for little subtle things that can make a big difference.

TCS: Is it fair to assume that Rebbetzin Sytner was helpful?

Patti: Extremely. She took the time at the event and she was gracious in sharing tips and templates when I followed up with her later.

TCS: What could possibly go wrong with the event?

Patti: The biggest concern is a fuse blowing but we actually tested to make sure the circuits could handle all the chulent pots. I have had to field a lot of questions; in particular, people could not understand why chulent was being prepared on a Thursday. But I did not want to risk the chance of something not working and also Friday can be tough to find the time.



TCS: You have been very careful about managing the costs.

Patti: Funds that come out of the bake auction which are normally turned into the shul were used to fund this event. In some years, a portion of the bake auction funds are allocated for siddurim for the woman's section. A few years ago when the shul needed funds to replenish toys for the youth program we used funds as well. But I believe this event will do a lot for the ruach and camaraderie of the shul and a small amount of funds are going to go a long way.



TCS: What has been most gratifying so far?

Patti: I did not have to convince anyone to be a contestant. I did not make one phone call. Also, the creativity of the contestants in taking some really amusing pictures using the chef paraphernalia.

TCS: I understand that David Orgel played a helping role.

Patti: David helped me out one day at Sobey's and was such a mensch. I determined that he would be a great resource for future events. And sure enough David found a sale from Wal-Mart online for \$19.99 crock pots.

TCS: Anyone else help?

Patti: Robert Morris provided logos for the aprons. Hadassah made a great flyer. Rabbi Rothman was very supportive of the concept.

TCS: Any difficult decisions?

Patti: Should we charge for contestants? I called Ruth Glatter as a voice reason but her husband Abe answered and he responded that if the contestants were supplying the ingredients then that should be enough of a contribution.



TCS: Why 6 contestants?

Patti: We wanted to keep the event manageable in the first year. We had others who were interested but we capped it at six to make sure we were on top of things.

TCS: Tell me about the contestants.

Patti: *Jeff Bernholtz*– I am scared. His ingredients are way out there.

Brian Waterman– he has a secret ingredient coming all the way from Israel.

Michael Ironi – mechanics don't cook, never would expect the two to go together, like a football player knitting.

Brian Singer – he is the most confident, he has done this before and is the most competitive.

Steve Beker – to what level of outrageousness will you take this and will there be beans in his chulent,



Dani Meisels – his reputation precedes him in the community and I was told that I have to enlist him.

TCS: Any concern about allegations of contestants cheating or using illegal ingredients?

Patti: Only Jeff. He can write a prescription that others can't.

TCS: What do they have in common?

Patti: Surprisingly all men. But I have come to learn much like BBQ'ing that even where the men are useless in the kitchen they have managed to be capable of creating a decent chulent.

TCS: Do you think there is hope for Charles.

Patti: Not a chance. He could not make a chulent to save his life.

TCS Editor: Fortunately, it is rare that chulent making skills are needed to save a life. There is a reason that chulent cooking is not taught in self defense classes.

TCS: Most frustrating part of organizing the event?

Patti: The contestants not replying to e-mails. Something I have come to learn in dealing with men. So I started to e-mail the wives of the contestants.

TCS: Any advice for the congregation on how to make the most of the event?


Patti: Recognize that time and effort went into the making of the chulent and organizing the event and enjoy even if the taste is not up to your standards. And if anyone thinks they can do better we would love to have them sign up for next year.

TCS: What do you see for the future of the event?

Patti: I anticipate a crowded room enjoying the chulent and community spirit. I would like to do it again and hope the positive experience will have the community calling for more. I need to remember to take the feedback in a positive way. Each compliment is confirmation that the event is successful and each criticism is an opportunity to improve.






