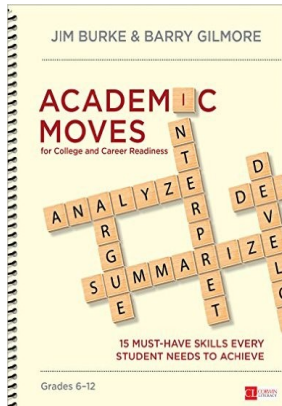

When students see a prompt that asks them to analyze, organize, and develop information, are they always prepared for all three of those tasks? What happens when we ask students to summarize, synthesize, or transform texts? Drawing from his work with Jim Burke, Barry will lead participants in discussions and activities related to specific academic tasks that students most often face on assignments. We'll have a chance to look at sample assignments and student writing, to see how ideas develop over the course of a text, and help students derive central ideas and find key supporting points in their reading material.
