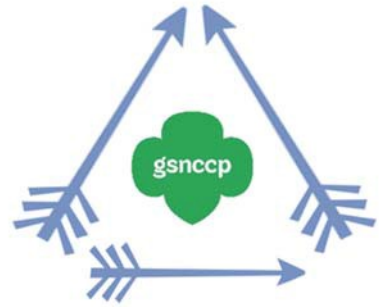


## 2018 Fall Leaderee

## Workshop Descriptions in Alphabetical Order

<b>Adult and Pediatric First Aid/CPR/AED – Blended</b> <b>Additional fee for this session: \$12.00</b>	<p>This course is open to anyone interested in obtaining Adult and Pediatric (Child and Infant) First Aid/CPR/AED certification and serving as a First Aider. This course combines online work and instructor-led practice and skill testing. Participants must be able to complete a minimum of two and a half hours of online coursework prior to attending training and be able to print off proof of completion for the instructor. A link to the online portion of the training will be emailed to participants one week prior. <b>Note: All participants registering for this class will receive a copy of the American Red Cross Student Manual (a \$9.00 savings) as part of our Leadee special!</b></p>
<b>Archery</b> <b>Additional fee for this session: \$25.00</b>	<p>Learn the sport of archery and all you need to know to give your girls this fun and unique experience. Who knows - you may be encouraging a future Olympian! This course meets National Archery Association standards for a basic instructor.  <b>Register for sessions—A, B, C, and D.</b></p>
<b>Australian Rug Hooking</b>	<p>Similar to rug hooking, locker hooking involves pulling scraps of fabric through a rug canvas that are "locked" into place by a hidden strand of yarn. It is incredibly easy and you can use almost any scrap fabric you can find. Learn this technique from "down under" to share with your girls! Participants will work on the technique while making a trivet sized "rug" that you'll start in class to finish at home!</p>
<b>Autumn Mason Jar Candle Holder</b>	<p>There are so many ways that you can decorate with mason jars! Come and learn how you can make a beautiful and inexpensive candle holder using autumn leaves!</p>
<b>Back-Pocket Games and Time Fillers</b>	<p>Do you struggle with ideas to fill the "down time"? Well, that won't be a problem after this session. Learn a variety of time fillers and games to have in your "back pocket" to keep your girls interested and engaged when your meeting plans or camp activities run short.</p>
<b>Bank Fishing</b>	<p>Sometimes we just want to sit back and relax! Bring your own supplies and enjoy some time on the bank of the pond while you sit back and fish at your own pace! All fish must be released back into the pond.</p>
<b>Basic Waterfront Skills - Canoeing</b>	<p>This is a recommended course for anyone looking to take our Small Craft Safety - Canoeing Certification course. We'll teach you the basic strokes and maneuvers needed to set you up for success when you arrive at the certification course!</p>
<b>Canvas Painting You Can Do with Your Girls</b>	<p>You don't have to be Picasso to create a masterpiece! Come and see how easy it is to create your own hand-painted work of art and then take this great project back to your girls to spark the painter in them too!</p>

<b>Clayworks: Shape and Form Air Dry Clay</b>	Learn how to shape, form and decorate a workable whistle from air dry clay. This activity will be easy to teach your girls and will provide hands on fun.
<b>Cooking with Pie Irons</b>	Pie irons aren't just for pies! Cooking with pie irons is another fun way to cook on charcoal while camping and can be used for every meal from breakfast to the main course to dessert! Participants will learn about the many different types of irons, proper use, care and cleaning and several recipes they can share with their troop! We'll even make a few to sample!
<b>Crochet Baby Caps</b>	Learn to crochet baby caps for preemies or newborns in this hands-on workshop! This is a great service project for older girls that you can take back to your troop to make and donate to hospitals in the U.S. or send overseas to struggling nations. <b>Participants must bring their own crochet hook – size will be emailed to you</b> ; yarn and patterns will be provided.
<b>Duct Tape Camping Crafts and Hacks</b>	Wherever you're headed, never leave home without your duct tape! In this session, we'll share some great duct tape hacks for camping and teach you how to use duct tape to make a water bottle carrier. Participants are encouraged to bring 2 rolls of their favorite, fun, and decorative duct tape for a more personalized project!
<b>Fall Wreath</b>	Cooler weather calls for a pretty new wreath on the front door! Learn to make an adorable wreath using a pool noodle and other pretties in this workshop!
<b>Holiday Ornaments</b>	Do you love the holidays? Are you looking for some new ornament ideas that you can make with your troop? Join Kim and get into the holiday spirit early as she teaches you how to make these adorable ornaments!
<b>Knot Board Fun</b>	Brush up on your skills and leave ready to teach your girls! Learn how to tie knots and make a reference board to impress your girls at your next campout!
<b>Learn to Cross Stitch</b>	Learn the basics of counted cross stitch in this hands-on session. Participants will be able to start a pattern to take home and finish!
<b>Let's Recertify – Outdoor Skills</b>	Every 5 years, outdoor certified adults are required to renew their certification. This blended course combines an online and in-person session to ensure volunteers have maintained their knowledge and provides updates on Safety Activity Checkpoints and best practices in camping.
<b>Let's Swap</b>	SWAPS are a Girl Scout tradition that are as popular today as they have ever been. In this session, we'll share the history of this tradition, SWAP etiquette, and several SWAP project ideas for girls of all grade-levels. Everyone will make a few SWAPS of their own and leave with lots of ideas to take back to your troop.

<b>Local-to-Global-to-Local</b>	The world keeps getting smaller and smaller, and girls today are one of the first generations to experience a truly global society. Learn what global means to Girl Scouts, the Girl Scout Program, our council, and our girls in this thought-provoking session! From participating in International Days sponsored by GSUSA (and activities troops and girls can do on those days) to introducing an international and global aspect to the troops in your area, to helping troops incorporate “global” into their Journeys, badges, and service projects, this session will spark a whole new appreciation for the many incredible global opportunities the Girl Scout program offers for girls!
<b>Mason Jar Lid Pumpkins</b>	Are you looking for a way to recycle your used canning lid bands? In this workshop you'll learn a simple way to add to your fall décor by turning them into a pumpkin!
<b>NC Barn Quilts: Bringing a Tradition East</b>	For years, travelers have enjoyed passing the beautifully painted barns along the NC Quilt Trail. In this session, Michele will share the history of the NC Quilt Trail while participants complete their own 12x12 barn quilt on canvas!
<b>PVC Trashcan</b>	Need somewhere to put that bag for trash while camping? Come make a portable PVC trashcan. It will also hold a dish basin for a single wash stand. This versatile, easy-to-put-together stand will hold a standard kitchen trash bag. This will be a great item to add to your camping gear and will really impress the girls in your troop or area!
<b>Recycled Newspaper Baskets</b>	Learn how you can turn newspaper into paper "tubes" and weave a beautiful basket with them in this hands-on workshop!
<b>Recycled Wind Chimes</b>	With just a little imagination you can turn everyday items into lyrical wind chimes! Join us as we show you how in this make-it and take-it workshop!
<b>Tie Dye T-Shirt</b>	Learn the easy art of tie-dying! Swirl, heart, trefoil, stripes - let your imagination be your guide. This is a great session to take back to your girls! <b><i>Participants must bring a plain white t-shirt to this session.</i></b>
<b>Twenty Questions: Girl Scout Style</b>	There are hundreds of Facebook groups for Girl Scout leaders. What we often find is that leaders gather information from these groups only to find that the information they have is not applicable to our council, and this creates confusion. The reason is because councils have the flexibility to determine their own policies and procedures for administering the program and meeting state and local requirements on risk and safety. In this session, we'll share answers to our most commonly asked questions as well as how you can find the answers to your questions using our council's resources.

<p><b>You Can Do It! Climb the Alpine Tower</b></p>	<p>Try your hand (and legs and heart) at climbing the Alpine Tower and see how far you can go. Didn't make it to the top? No problem. No matter what, you'll experience the same thrill and sense of accomplishment the girls do when they take on the Tower! One of our most popular camp activities, you'll learn about "challenge by choice" and you'll be able to share your own story with your girls and get them excited about this unique Girl Scout activity!</p>
