Description

This in-depth one day course is specifically designed to give participants opportunities to acquire and apply the knowledge and the skills they need to successfully carry out their responsibilities as members of governing bodies for Head Start Programs. This course offers a framework for clarifying expectations to the organizations that receive Head Start funds and for guiding them in determining their responsibilities with respect to their Head Start programs. It provides concrete, practical information that can be used in the context of a local agency's unique history, issues, resources and priorities.

Who Should Take This Course?

This course is intended for governing bodies of Head Start grantees and delegate agencies. It is also appropriate for policy groups (Policy Councils or Policy Committees), Executive directors, and Head Start and Early Head Start directors who provide support to and are participating in the governance process.
