## Celebrating our Different Gifts

We are reminded in Romans 12:6 that God has given us all different gifts, all for a special purpose. Each of us experiences challenges as well as strengths, and each can be used to glorify God. The adults and children in the SVPC LOGOS Program recently experienced this through a **DisAbility Awareness Night**. The evening highlighted some personal stories, as well as some hands-on learning experiences.

It was a joy to watch the children embracing the opportunities to learn how it might feel to be in someone else's shoes or chair, and to hear their compassion and empathy expressed. They experienced rotations in which they tried using a

wheelchair; a sight-seeing cane to guide them; braille blocks to read without seeing; writing with oven mitts to help understand how someone with cerebral palsy experiences muscular challenges; reading cryptic messages and using modified

glasses to experience reading as if you have dyslexia and other vision challenges. It was a time to ask questions and share in a safe space open for wondering and learning. Two short videos were presented that helped  
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
all of us to understand how to interact more appropriately with someone who seems different than us. Let's just say, we learned a lot!

One sacred moment was when one of our LOGOS students raised his hand and said, "I just want to give a shout out to my brother who has cerebral palsy. He is one of the nicest people I know."

I feel blessed to be a part of this community that values ALL people and to be a part of supporting a

ministry of inclusion and respect for each other's differences. So many in this church community give of their time to be buddies for some of our kids with special needs and even more give financially to make this ministry possible. What a gift this church is to the special needs community!

# The View From Here

*Dear Sunnyvale*

*Presbyterian Family,*

I recently shared with you the idea that our stories are an essential foundation for our faith. And I have been grateful for the ways that you all have begun to share your stories with me.

I also know that many of you joined together to celebrate **Ann Coleman's** life, and her entry into the Church triumphant. Leading up to that day many of you shared stories about Ann, about **Rev. Dr. Bruce Coleman**, and the profound impact they both had through their service at SVPC. All of this has deepened my gratitude—that you have allowed me a place in a long line of blessed servants, that we have all inherited a rich treasure of faithfulness, that we get to

continue to bear Christ's good news through our ministries and wonderful community.

The stories of those gone before us are indeed a solid foundation for our faith at SVPC. I will leave you with just one more example of this. Here are a few words that Dr. Coleman wrote for the newsletter in 1975 that still ring true today:

“In a time of tremendous power for destruction in war, in a time of great shortages in many places for healthy living, in a time

when some rather substantial persons have apparently been unworthy of our trust; where do we look for that which gives life a foundation, a place upon which to build? ...To a Christ who is the same yesterday, today, and forever.... Let's try trusting Him for 40 days and 40 nights...and then as long as life lasts!”

## Make Meaning Before Money

Monday, April 9, 7:30–9 PM, Fellowship Hall

Where and why we create value for others (innovation) and how we imagine God to be involved in our meaning-making (theology) and value-making (economics) should become increasingly important to Christians in the Silicon Valley. Luke's Gospel challenges our propensity to make value without meaning (Luke 19:1–27), and the good soil Jesus refers to in His parable (Matthew 13:3–14) challenges the way our consumer society increasingly compartmentalizes value.

**Lanny Vincent** will present a short lecture based on his essay in *A Primer on Innovation Theology: Responding to Change in the Company of God* (2017), followed by an interview with **Barry Vickrey** and questions from those present.

*For thirty-five years Lanny Vincent has been facilitating invention and foresight with Fortune 500 companies seeking to innovate. Formerly a Presbyterian pastor in the South and Midwest, Lanny continues to make sense of change and innovation with the inspired guidance of the biblical canon, even from his garage in the San Francisco Bay Area. Barry Vickrey is the lead elder for the Discipleship ministry area at SVPC and a retired law school dean and professor.*

## Financial Update through January

We have two months left in our fiscal year and here's how we are doing:

\$1,575K	Income
-\$1,511K	Expenses
\$ 64K	Surplus

Both contributions and expenses continue to be close to the budget resulting in a \$64K surplus, but spending in both February and March are expected to be higher than income, so it is likely we will end the year with a deficit. 
