## CARAVAN 2018: From Charity to Solidarity

The CARAVAN 2018 trip to Tucson, Arizona kept classic CARAVAN traditions—making friendship bracelets, bonding of students and advisors, and seeing anew God's wonder. But this year's trip also broke new ground with its focus on solidarity versus charity. In charity you are sympathizing for a cause and often providing aid with money or services, where in solidarity the goal is to empathize by actually putting yourself in the position of others and being together with the affected people.

The goal of this CARAVAN was not to send a group of students to provide charity, but rather



for those students to be educated on important and controversial issues and stand in alliance with the communities impacted by an oppressive and unfair immigration system. In Arizona we spent a lot of our time hearing from different organizations that provide aid to immigrants by, for example, putting out water on commonly used desert trails, offering safe housing, and providing access to lawyers

that help immigrants when seeking asylum or simply fighting for basic rights. One of the most powerful experiences of the trip was our visit to the U.S. District Courthouse in Tucson, where our group witnessed the conviction of over 70 newly immigrated people in less than a two-hour period. The people being tried included young men and women, some in wheelchairs, *Continued on next page...*

some on crutches, and many whose first language was neither English nor Spanish (the only two languages used in the courtroom). This experience, along with the testimonies of several individuals who had immigrated themselves and graciously shared their stories with our group, really brought to light the significance of a flawed U.S. immigration system and how it impacts individuals seeking peace and safety for themselves and their families.

While the focus of CARAVAN was rather a controversial topic, the best part of the annual trip continues to be the relationships formed and strengthened between students, advisors, and God. God's faithfulness and presence during this challenging week was undeniable in the hearts of those in and around our group and in the wonder of the breathtaking desert landscape. The community built and love experienced on CARAVAN each year is truly exceptional and affects the lives of all who participate.

## Parents—Ready for a Date Night?

Parent's Night Out (PNO) is a Christian cooperative child care program at Sunnyvale Presbyterian Church. PNO is administered and staffed by participating couples, and overseen by the Director of Family Ministries. The program runs on a 16-week trimester basis. Families are expected to commit to the entire trimester. PNO currently meets Saturday nights from 5:30–8:30 PM.

During the three-hour program, the children enjoy age-appropriate activities, a snack, and a movie. Two couples provide supervision

## Spaces for Children in Worship



As you attend worship in August, look around the sanctuary for special areas set up for children to worship. You will see cozy spots to sit, with low tables, cushions, and baskets with books and paper and markers. These spaces, called **Praygrounds**, offer a space where children can see and be engaged, a space that's especially for them.



Research has shown over time that when children who are separated from the worshipping community get to an age to decide for themselves if they want to continue going to church, they often decide not to be part of worship because it hasn't been part of their life. We are all adopted through our baptism into God's family, so we need to worship together. We know children need to move and have some active time and therefore we need to find creative ways of engaging children in worship. These Praygrounds can provide just the kind of space to help with this.

Children's and Worship teams are grateful to our session for seeing this need, and approving the change of having children in worship on a monthly basis. We are excited to welcome our children regularly into all aspects of worship where they will develop a sense of belonging to the church community and develop their identity with the people of God and as a person of God. Welcome the children around you in worship!

Some are already responding to our requests for additional giving as can be seen above in our first quarter results with giving slightly ahead of budget by \$9K. Expenses are well below plan due to open staff positions and timing differences for Vacation Bible School and CARAVAN deposits/expenses.

We hope to perform better than budget on income and expenses so that we end the year with a surplus instead of the current plan of \$188K deficit.
