School on Good Friday: A Rich Religious Landscape Opportunity



With spring breaks and travels waning, we are hoping that many will participate in the inspirational and devotional Holy Week at Our Lady of Grace. I have asked the teachers to not assign homework from Holy Thursday through the Easter Weekend and to not schedule any tests on Good Friday in order to encourage family attendance at our parish Stations and

liturgies.

Last spring SAC discussed honoring Good Friday as a designated school day at OLG this year. Often our students and families are on vacation during Holy Week. I know there are various reasons why some would not want OLG to be in session on Good Friday. ***Being in session provides us a wonderful opportunity for a Good Friday experience for all of our students.*** I like to think that we are a school of the Gospel and we would be remiss as a Catholic School, a school called to provide a rich religious landscaping for our children, to ignore this opportunity to convey the magnitude of Good Friday to all of our students.

Fr. Neil purchased crosses for all of our students to hold as they pray the Stations on Good Friday. The crosses will be blessed after next Wednesday's Mass with holy water from the Jordan River. We asked Fr. Neil to take a picture of the actual stations on the Via Delarosa as our OLG group followed the path of Jesus in Jerusalem. These pictures will be the backdrops of our outdoor Stations for our students. Our 7th graders will be the leaders for each homeroom praying the Stations. Teachers will be offering various faith opportunities throughout the day and our teachers will be communicating the grade level schedule of their observance for Good Friday. This will not be an ordinary school day. We wish many blessings on all of our students and families during Holy Week and their Easter celebrations!

At the same time, students in grades 4-6 completed a similar survey detailing their experience transitioning from a traditional grading system to standards-based grading. The Education Committee of the School Advisory Council will take time over the next several weeks to organize and review the results of this survey. The committee will then work in conjunction with administration and the teachers to discuss and carry out any modifications and improvements to the implementation of standards-based grading moving forward.
