An active spear fisherman, photographer, and local conservationist, Clark McNulty, along with his brother Rhett and their Oceans Global partners, have established the ***Kirk McNulty Annual White Seabass Spear Fishing Tournament***, benefiting the White Seabass Hatchery Program under the Hubbs-SeaWorld Research Institute. The tournament attracts top west coast spear fisherman, and will support the data collection efforts of the Hatchery as it tracks the success of the release programs along the coast. Clark will also give us insight into the sport of spearfishing, and some of the related conservation efforts in place to support the local marine habitat. Clark is the founder of Oceans Global, providing ocean-based activities and volunteering opportunities for people suffering from substance abuse.
