#### **Rich Abele: USS IOWA's WWII Anti-Aircraft Operations**

During WWII, the *USS IOWA* bristled with anti-aircraft (AA) guns and hundreds of sailors to man them, providing essential AA support to the fast fleet as they brought the war to Japan. Retired USN Captain Rich Abele will introduce the three systems used on the *IOWA*, how they were deployed, and their effectiveness in combatting the enemy threat from the skies.

Capt. Jennifer will share stories from her recent travels to South America and Southeast Asia—including some of their crazy “road trips” ashore, potential locales for “ex-pat” hopefuls, and boat repair in exotic places. #### **Rich Abele: Museum Battleship USS IOWA (BB-61)**

Captain Rich Abele served two tours in Vietnam and commanded two mine hunters. He also served as a contracts manager on the B-1B bomber and C-17 cargo aircraft programs for The Boeing Company. He now spends much of his time volunteering aboard the museum battleship *USS IOWA*, and will share his knowledge of its construction, deployment in the Atlantic, and engagements in the South Pacific during WWII, Korean Conflict, and Cold War. He will also provide useful information about visiting and supporting the ship.
