Welcome Pastor Renee Ahern

As we continue our Re-Formation Journey, connecting to both our history as Lutherans (tracing our pathways back to the Reformation in 1517) and our long history of Peace Lutheran Church (tracing our pathways back to 1838), we discover the Spirit of God leading us on new paths, over and over again.

Pastor Renee Ahern launched a new era for us at Peace Lutheran Church in 1983 by becoming the first ordained woman on the pastoral staff. The Lutheran Church opened the doors for the ordination of women in the prior decade. The people of Peace, as was consistent throughout their history, were open to the new movements of the Spirit and the ongoing re-formation journey.

Since her time at Peace, when she served with Senior Pastor Dwight Hedrick and her husband the Rev. Dr. Robert Ahern, she has served the church in regional bodies (Trinity Lutheran Seminary and both Mount Carmel and Nationwide Children’s Hospitals) as well as local congregations in Marysville, Waldo, and Prospect, Ohio. She is currently Senior Pastor at Good Hope Lutheran Church in Bucyrus.

Renee and Bob have three sons, Robert III, Martin and Luke. Luke (who often plays in the contemporary band) and his wife Kelsey are Peace Members and parents to two children, KJ and Javon.

We are grateful for Renee’s presence with us today and for her embodied witness to the way the Spirit breathes new life and direction into the church.

SET—Helping Those in Need



“Helping Those in Need”

In 2005, Peace members Joe and Janet Schmitt heard God’s call To Love Neighbor, and they responded, donating six acres of land in Vinton County, to create Southeast Testament (SET), a nonprofit community organization that is dedicated to helping residents in 23 counties in central and southeastern Ohio.

God had a plan for six acres of land in Vinton County, and the faithful members of Peace Lutheran Church heard the call and responded. For two years, beginning in 2005, they cleared the wooded, overgrown acres to prepare the building site. During this time \$130,000 in financial support was raised, given by those who believed in a dream of opportunity and renewed hope for the people of Southeast Ohio. In October of 2007, a 6,700 sq ft building was raised and soon after, the interior was completed; all done primarily by the manual labor of Peace volunteers.

Beginning July 1, 2017 the Sojourners Care Network moved part of their operation into the SET building. Founded in 1999, with headquarters in McArthur, their initial mission centered on helping foster care youth. Today the mission has expanded and they provide a variety of programs including: foster care, runaway and homeless youth services, employment training, diploma and GED support, mentoring, leadership training, supportive services, and service learning opportunities as well as distributing donated furniture, household items, and appliances to needy residents of Southeast Ohio.
