Below, the Dalton Convention & Visitors Bureau has highlighted a few fun places in Dalton to make your staycation more enjoyable.

1. Escape Revolution – 2708 Airport Road Suite 2 Escape Dalton – 244 N. Hamilton Street

Heritage Point Park features one of the few Disc Golf courses in Georgia. It's a ton of fun for the whole family. Disc Golf follows many of the basic rules of standard golf.

5. Dalton Distillery Tour – 109 E. Morris Street

Ever wanted to know how moonshine is made? Wonder no more. The Dalton Distillery offers tours of its facility Tuesday through Saturday from 10 AM to 5 PM. The Butler family can't remember not making whiskey. Opening this distillery is a son's way of keeping an American tradition alive and honoring his father and grandfather's brave ways by offering the world their family recipe corn whiskey. So go on by, meet Master Distiller Raymond Butler, and sample some of the world's best Moonshine. Dalton Distillery is also brewing up the world's first distilled spirits using Sunflower seeds!

6. Tunnel Hill Heritage Center and Historic Railroad Tunnel – 215 Clisby Austin Drive, Tunnel Hill, Georgia, 30755

Come see one of Georgia's most unique attractions. The 1850 Railroad Tunnel, one of the oldest railroad tunnels in the South; open 6 days a week. Visit the museum, and take a guided tour of the 1,477 ft. railroad tunnel, as well as the 1848 Clisby Austin House, the 1900's era replica General Store, and enjoy the outdoors on walking paths through the 85+ acre site.

7. Creative Arts Guild – 520 W. Waugh Street

Art instruction including dance, music, theatre, visual art, pottery, gymnastics and tumbling. Gallery exhibits. Festivals, Concert Series and Sculpture Garden.



8. Whitfield-Murray Historical Society – 715 Chattanooga Ave

Whitfield-Murray Historical Society is dedicated to preserving the history and culture of Whitfield and Murray County. Historical society properties include the Hamilton House, the Huff House, the Blunt House, and Dug Gap Battle Park in Whitfield County; the Wright Hotel, Chatsworth Depot, and the Spring Place Methodist Church in Murray County, Georgia. Go for a tour of one, or all of the properties.

9. Hike the Disney Trail – U.S. 41,

West of Dalton, this steep trail ascends Rocky Face Mountain. Considered by many to be the most challenging trail in Northwest Georgia, Disney derives its name from the lone grave of an English-born Confederate named George Disney. His grave is located at the end of the trail where Disney fell. Access begins behind the Nazarene Church at I-75, exit 336m Hwy 41-North one Mile.

10. Nob North Golf Course – 298 Nob North Drive, Cohutta, Georgia 30710

A Gary Player designed golf course, this 40-year-old venue features all the amenities of a private club without membership fees. 6,573 yards, par 72, and open seven days a week during daylight hours.

There you have it, 10 great things to do in Dalton. Deciding to take a staycation is easy. There's no packing, no booking hotels, or planning activities for the family. Everything you do on a staycation is located right here. Dalton has plenty of places to eat, shop, play, and relax. Instead of spending money on a vacation somewhere else this year, how about considering a staycation in Dalton!

Local Historical Properties

Built in 1855, the original Huff House faced the railroad tracks. After serving as the headquarters for General Joseph E. Johnston during the Civil War occupation of Dalton, the home was purchased by the Huff family. The historic house was rotated 180 degrees in 1904 by jacking the house up onto round logs, which were then harnessed to mules and pulled, a process that took over 2 weeks. The family lived in the house during this process!

Built in 1840, The Hamilton House is the oldest home in Dalton. The home contains the Lesche Room which features, not only the antique Lesche furniture, but also Robert Loveman's personal writing desk and book collection. The Lesche Club, which was founded by Dalton Female College graduates, is the oldest literary club within the United States. The club still meets and studies various literary pieces, including Robert Loveman's poems and writings.

Built in 1891 as the offices to Crown Cotton Mills, the building today serves as the headquarters for the Whitfield-Murray Historical Society. One unique component of the property is the original city water source and pump house. Thanks to the high producing Hamilton Spring, downtown Dalton was privileged to have city water very early on in its development.



Two Union soldiers were awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor for rescuing a fellow soldier during the battle. The soldiers placed cast iron skillet over their heads for protection from artillery, then crawled onto the field under a blanket, which they used to carry the wounded soldier off the field.

Thomas Wright opened the hotel in 1909 and passed it on to his daughter, Kate Raine. Ms. Raine was a nurse to Native Americans out West and brought her nursing paraphernalia and various Indian artifacts back to Chatsworth with her, which are now on display at the hotel.

The depot was relocated from its original location beside the railroad tracks to behind the Wright Hotel. The depot houses the Talc Museum exhibit which contains a collection of historical information and artifacts relating to the historic talc industry in Murray County. The depot also is the home to a multitude of model trains, which are always running when the building is open.

The church, which was erected around 1875, is the oldest public meeting building in Murray County. The congregation began as an Indian mission in the early 1800s, but later moved during the Trail of Tears. The "owl" atop the church is often used as a landmark for the locals.

DEM Camp Continues to Grow

As an effort to share career opportunities in Greater Dalton, the Chamber, the Boys and Girls Club of Gordon, Murray and Whitfield, Shaw Industries and Mohawk Industries stepped up to provide a free camp for middle school students focused on design, engineering and manufacturing. This first camp was held in June 2011 with 29 students attending. After seven successful years of DEM Camp, 133 students graduated this year, 100 new campers and 33 returning campers. Twenty-four business and education partners have now joined to make this experience of no cost to all participants.

Brian Cooksey of Shaw Industries partnered with Barbara Ward of the Greater Dalton Chamber in creating the concept and curriculum for Dem Camp in 2011. Brian states, “DEM Camp is a key part of our local workforce development strategy. Through this experience, we introduce students to skills and career opportunities in our local manufacturing organizations that they were not previously aware of. Talented members of our local companies help inspire the next generation to see what might be possible for their career.”

During the week, campers experience team building activities, build electronics circuit boards, create carpet designs, build a rapid prototype car to race, practice accurate measurement activities, create laser designs, experience programming industrial and Lego robotics, have a career exploration session with a middle school counselor, and tour local industries. Campers complete all of these activities with industrial safety in mind. The returning campers work in teams to design and build solid fuel rockets and a hover craft that is powered by leaf blowers. The returning campers also spend a day at Dalton State College where they have a session with a Chemistry Professor and an Engineering Professor. They also have a presentation on sustainability, learning about caring for our planet.



The key to workforce development is to begin instilling information about exciting career opportunities in design, engineering and manufacturing at an early age. During the 7 years of DEM Camp, over 500 students have participated. In addition, creators of the camp are pleased that a number of other communities in Georgia have asked for the camp design and are implementing similar camps in their communities.

Elizabeth Phelan, who has had both of her children attend DEM Camp, shares her thoughts, "DEM Camp has been an incredible opportunity of hands on learning mixed with fun for both my children. The time spent has opened their eyes to experiences & possibilities that they would have never known about. There are no "impossibles" only the encouragement of let's make your vision "possible".... DEM is jewel of the Dalton community!!!!!"

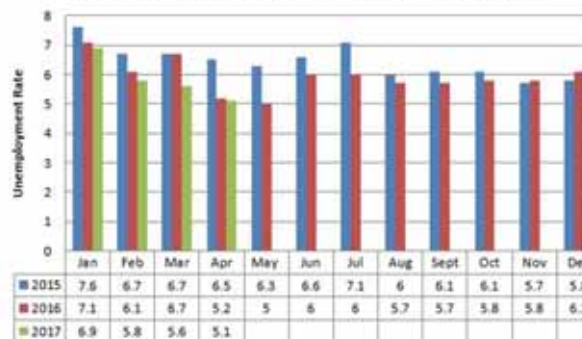

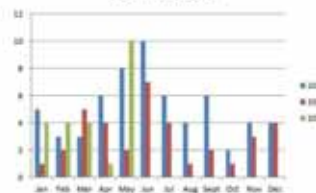

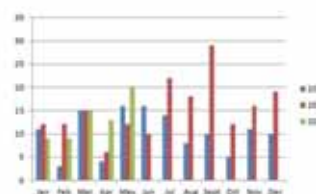
