The Order of the Daughters of the King, Diocese of Hawaii, is inviting all women of the Diocese to our Annual Quiet Day. This is a day for scripture-led reflection, prayer and guidance for spiritual renewal. Our theme this year is "Praying with Hope."

In these troubling times, we may feel that nothing is within our control or reach; however, we can pray, diligently and fervently. Join us as we experience reverence and meaningful dialogue as well as peace, quiet and fellowship in beautiful surroundings.

Quiet Day will be on Saturday, March 10, 2018, from 8:30 AM to 2:00 PM.

The Quiet Day begins with Registration at St. Damien's House, St. Anthony's Retreat Center, 3351 Kalihi Street, Honolulu, HI 96829. From 8:30-9:00 AM, light refreshments will be offered. We plan to have our DOK HI Chaplain, the Reverend Ernesto Pasalo, Jr. (Father JaR) join us at 09:15 AM for opening prayer and to preside at the Eucharist. Beginning at 10:30 AM, there will be activities and readings to guide our mediations and prayer. Please bring your Bible as we reflect upon references in scripture about prayer with hope.

At noon we will gather for lunch and fellowship. We ask that you bring your own "brown bag" lunch, following which there will be time for quiet, personal meditation. The day ends at 2:00 PM. Each attendee will be given a memento to take home at the end of the day.

1. Use live layout and alignment guides

Click the image below and drag it around the page. With images that have text wrapping, the text moves around the picture so you get a live preview of the new layout. Try to line the image up with the top of this paragraph to see how the alignment guides can help you position it on the page. 2. Collaborate in Simple Markup View

The new Simple Markup revision view presents a clean, uncomplicated view of your document, but you still see markers where changes and comments have been made. Click on the vertical bar on the left side of the text to see changes [like this one](#). Or click the comment icon on the right to check out [comments about this text](#).

3. Insert Online Pictures and Video

Add and play online videos inside your Word documents. Add your pictures from online photo services without having to save them first to your computer. Click **Insert > Online Video** to add a video to this document.

4. Enjoy the Read

Use the new Read Mode for a beautiful, distraction-free reading experience. Click **View** > **Read Mode** to check it out. While you're there, try double clicking on a picture to get a closer view. Click outside the image to return to reading.

5. Edit PDF content in Word

Open PDFs and edit the content in Word. Edit paragraphs, lists, and tables just like familiar Word documents. Take the content and make it look great.

Download [this helpful PDF from the Office site](#) to try in Word or pick a PDF file on your computer. In Word, click **File** > **Open** and navigate to the PDF. Click **Open** to edit the content or read it more comfortably using the new Read Mode.
