FEATURED ARTICLE: LATEST DATA BRIEF FROM THE ILLINOIS VIOLENT DEATH REPORTING SYSTEM

Homicide in Chicago Community Areas 2007-2015

For the first time, data detailing homicide rates by community area over an extended time period has been made available.

Unfortunately, the data confirm what many have suspected. The risk for homicide is concentrated in a few Chicago community areas and this disproportionate distribution of risk has been the case for an extended period of time. The good news is that community violence is preventable and evidence-based strategies for reducing violence are expanding. The [Illinois Violent Death Reporting System](#) (IVDRS) sees this data as a resource to guide communities in addressing violent deaths in affected areas across Chicago.
