One of the largest sources of illegally trafficked firearms in the nation is gun dealers. In Chicago, 40% of guns used in crimes between 2009 and 2014 came from within our own state. There are also more gun dealers in Illinois than Starbucks and McDonald's combined. By passing the [Gun Dealer Licensing Act](#) (SB1657), gun dealers in Illinois will be encouraged to use better business practices and corrupt operations will be held accountable. You can help to raise awareness, elevate the voices of survivors and urge lawmakers to do their part to help our children grow up free from gun violence.
