

## **Veteran's Day Prayer Service**

**11/11/16**

*As we gather today, we pray in a special way for all those who have passed away. First, we recall all the members of the Notre Dame community who have recently passed on. We pray that the Lord will welcome them into heaven, and that God will pour out His comfort and strength upon their families.*

*We also pray for all the men and women who died while serving their country. We ask God to welcome them into His Heavenly Kingdom, and to bestow on us a spirit of humble gratitude for their heroic sacrifice. We especially pray for the following Notre Dame alumni and friends who perished in combat while serving their country:*

### **Graduates Who Made the Ultimate Sacrifice**

- George Richard Fitzgerald, Class of 1961, from Bridgeport, a member of the US Marine Corps, who died in combat on September 17, 1966, while serving in Vietnam
- David William Coppernoll, Class of 1961, from Bridgeport, a member of the US Army, who died in combat at age 26 on January 8, 1970, when his helicopter crashed, while serving in Vietnam. He served as a Green Beret in the 5<sup>th</sup> Special Forces group and died two days before he was supposed to return to the United States.
- Thomas John Bowe, Class of 1965, from Stratford, a member of the US Army, who died in combat on March 8, 1969, while serving in Vietnam.
- Russell Thomas Fant, Class of 1966, from Bridgeport, a member of the US Army, who died in combat on February 3, 1969, while serving in Vietnam
- Jack Richard DaCosta, Class of 1966, from Bridgeport, a member of the US Army, who died in combat on December 2, 1969, while serving in Vietnam. Mr. DaCosta was Special Forces Group Airborne and an Infantry Unit Commander.
- Thomas Brown, Class of 2000, from Shelton, a member of the US Army, who died in combat on September 23, 2008, while serving in Iraq.

*And we pray for all veterans alive today, and for all members of the armed forces who are currently serving as defenders of our country. We also pray for those veterans who did not die during combat, but who passed on after their service to their country was completed. May God bless and protect them as they have protected us, and may God also abundantly bless their families. We pray especially for the following Notre Dame alumni who have served or are currently serving in the military:*

- Jack French, Class of 1960, who served over 20 years in the military, including three tours in Vietnam as an Army helicopter pilot.
- From the Class of 1960: Joseph Bender and James Demma – US Army.

- Mike Ceruzzi who served in the Navy from 1966 until 1976.
- William LaBaugh who served in the Medical Service Corp for 25 years before retiring as a Lieutenant Colonel.
- Also, from the Class of 1961: Jim Pinard – Air Force, Art Lawrence – Army, Ray Van Stone – Navy, Joseph Piazza – Army, John McCartney – Air Force, George Sherwood – Army, Richard Fry – Air Force, David Murcko – Army and Robert Urbanowicz – Navy.

- James Carletti who served as a captain in the US Navy and the JAG Corps from 1967 until 1998.
- William Fitzgerald who served in both the Marines and the U.S. Air Force
- James Magyar who served in the US Army in Vietnam from 1967 to 1969. He was awarded the Bronze Star, which is the fourth highest individual military award and the Air Medal.
- Kevin Conlisk – US Navy from 1966 to 69
- Don Johnson – US Navy from 1962 to 66
- Richard Grich who served in the US Navy and the Reserve Officers Candidate program from 1966 to 1970.
- Joseph Peddle, Jr, who served in the US Navy aboard the USS Windham County which participated in the landing at DaNang, South Vietnam.
- Also from the Class of 1962 - Joseph Maco, US Navy, Edward Agonis - Air Force, Charles Strba – Air Force, Thomas Cherry – Navy, Robert Braychak – Army, Thomas Cherry – Navy, Jim D'Agostino – Marines, Paul Fasold – Air Force, Bernie Gaydos – Army, Frank DeDonne, Army, and Gilbert Regan

From the Class of 1963:

- James Skarupa who served in the Navy from 1965 to 1971 and was based on battleships in the Mediterranean Sea as an Electrician's Mate Second Class.

- Mario Bonetti who served in Vietnam from 1968 to 1971.
- Robert Sisbarro who served in Vietnam and received a Purple Heart and Bronze Star.
- Michael McCann who was a Green Beret and a recipient of the Purple Heart and Bronze Star for Valor.
- Robert Halky who served in the US Army from 1967 to 69
- Also from the Class of 1963: William Stockell, Joe Alves, Robert Wight – US Navy, Daniel McCarthy – National Guard, Thomas Keating – US Army, Donald Cunningham – Army, Cliff Haury – Army, Tom Koronkiewicz – Navy, John

- George Burr who served on active duty in the US Navy from 1967 to 1968 and in the US Navy Reserves until 1971.
- Robert Ledalytner, a decorated combat veteran who passed away several years ago.
- Domenic J. Paniccia who served in the US Army from 1969 to 1971.
- Joe Palsa who served in the Army from 1967 to 1970.

- Pat Freeman who served in the Marines during Vietnam
- Anthony Cedrone who served in the US Navy during Vietnam.
- Also from the Class of 1965: Paul Leska, a Navy Corpsman, Thomas Lopez – US Army, Kenneth Fodor – Coast Guard, Richard Halligan – Air Force, John Nawowski – Army, Tim Reitano and Joseph Riccio.
- Bob Deveau, former ND physical education teacher and football coach from 1961 to 1966, who served in the Marines.

- Thomas Fedele, Class of 1969, who served in Vietnam in 1970 and 1971 as a member of the 11<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> Special Forces Unit and retired from the Army Reserves in 2001.
- Alvaro Suarez, Class of 1970, who served in Vietnam in 1972 and 1973. He enlisted in the Army Reserves in 1985, served on reserve and active duty for 34 years, including a tour of Iraq in 2003 and 2004 and was a Special Agent with the US Army Criminal Investigative Division.
- Marty Foncello, Class of 1970, who served in the US Army on active duty from 1974 to 1979 and in the Army Reserve and Army National Guard from 1979 to 2002. Mr. Foncello retired as a Lieutenant Colonel.
- Dan Augustine, Class of 1970, who served in the US Army for 25 years. He retired a colonel, but not before seeing service in 20 different countries. He is a veteran of the Panama invasion and Operation Desert Storm. He also served in the Pentagon on the Joint Chiefs of Staff.
- Also from the Class of 1970: Randy Chiarenzelli - Army National Guard, Robert Flynn - Coast Guard, Arthur Johnson and Richard Marusa - both US Army.
- From the Class of 1971: Charles Potter - US Air Force and Richard Fohrenbach who served in the US Navy from 1973 to 1978 as a hospital corpsman.
- Thomas Foncello, Class of 1971, who served in the US Air Force from 1972 to 1975 as a jet engine mechanic. Mr. Foncello also served in the Connecticut Air National Guard from 1979 to 1983.
- From the Class of 1972: Victor Becker – Navy, Vincent Capuano – Navy, Robert Iacurci – Army, Pat McNiff – Army, and Phil Halligan – Air Force
- William Martin, Class of 1973, is a 27 year veteran in the US Army and most recently was stationed in Afghanistan.

- Sue Roos, Class of 1981, who served in the Army for four years.
- Robert Seltenerich, Class of 1981, who served in the Army from 1988 to 1991 as a combat medic in Operation Desert Shield and Desert Storm and received the Combat Medical Badge.
- Michael Harrigan, Class of 1982, US Army.
- Jeffrey Heyse, Class of 1982, who served 24 years in the Air Force, retiring as a major in 2007. He is a veteran of Operation Enduring Freedom and served in Afghanistan.
- Dean Danas, who served 25 years in the Air Force and Fred Hill, US Marines, both Class of 1983
- Rodney Garcia, Class of 1983, who served in the Air Force National Guard from 1983 to 2003 and was deployed to Italy, Norway and Turkey.
- From the Class of 1984: Edward Muldoon – US Navy, Steve Moran - US Navy, Dan Marrash – Marines, Kevin O’Leary – Army, and Chris Weller – Marines.
- Greg Florence, Class of 1984, who served in the US Navy from 1988 to 2009 and retired as a Commander.
- From the Class of 1985: Tony Rinaldi, US Air Force, Ed Devillers who attended the Naval Academy and then enlisted in the US Marine Corps.
- Lucendia Isler, Class of 1985, who served in the US Air Force for ten years
- Robert William Corris, Class of 1985, who served in the US Marine Corps from 1988 to 1994 and is a veteran of Operation Desert Storm.
- Peter Hristov, Class of 1985, US Navy.

- Julia Smith-Meade, Class of 1985, who retired in July, 2014 as a Colonel in the US Marine Corps
- William Loughman, Class of 1986, who served in the US Army and Army Reserves from 1987 to 1994
- Gary Krysta, Class of 1986, who served in the Navy on board the USS San Diego during the First Gulf War.
- Sueann Schorr, Class of 1987, who has served in the US Navy since 1991.
- Linda Cunha, Class of 1988, who currently in her 26<sup>th</sup> year of active duty with the Army National Guard. Having served in Iraq in 2004 and 2005, she also served in Afghanistan.
- Matthew Merced, Class of 1988, who served five years active duty in the US Marine Corps from 1993 to 1998
- Christopher Sevick, Class of 1990, US Air Force
- Greg Howard, Class of 1998 – US Marines

- Joseph Calvi, Jr, a cousin of Mrs. Miller, who served in Vietnam and Mrs. Miller's uncle, Peter Valenti, who served in the Army during WWII.

- Charles and Zigmund Zawadski, uncles of Mrs. Daniels. Charles was killed in action during the Korean War and Zigmund served in the Air Force until his retirement.
- Joseph Saia, father of Mrs. Marzik, who served in the National Guard in Vietnam and Vincent Marzik, Mrs. Marzik's father-in-law, who served in the Air Force during Korea.
- Brian St. Onge, father of Mr. St. Onge, who served in the Air Force during Vietnam. Edward St. Onge, Mr. St. Onge's grandfather, who served in the Army

during WWII and Phillip and Nicolas Buonocore, uncles of Mr. St. Onge, who served in the military during Vietnam.

- Robert Christy, Mr. Philipp's grandfather, who served during the Korean War.
- Raymond Guarino, uncle of Ms. Longo, who died while fighting in Vietnam.
- Joseph Feeley, father of Mrs. Bogan, who served in the Navy during WWII.
- Walter Ezepchick, father-in-law of Mrs. Ezepchick, who served in the Army during WWII and Mrs. Ezepchick's uncle, Joseph Shea, who died while fighting in World War II.
