Are you a full-time college sophomore, junior or senior? Do you have a G.P.A. of 3.0 or higher? Do you have an exceptional interest in pursuing a career in journalism, advertising or marketing? If so, you're eligible to apply.

What?

This fall, the California Press Foundation will award up to four \$2,500 grants to worthy college students. Grants will be awarded after winners secure and begin internships of six weeks or more at CNPA-member newspapers in Spring or Summer 2019. **Start looking for an internship now.**

When?

Applications for the 2019 California Press Foundation Internship Grants program must be **postmarked by Nov. 16, 2018**.

1. A letter of recommendation from a professor in your field of interest (news or advertising).
3. A letter of recommendation from a current or former employer. If not possible, submit a letter of recommendation from someone who can attest to your character and sense of responsibility.
4. An essay no longer than 500 words on this topic: Amid advances in technology and changes in audience behavior, newspaper companies continue to produce vital and relevant journalism. What traits and skills of yours do you believe would contribute to the newspaper industry's durability, and how do you believe you would be able to immerse yourself in this culture?
5. Submit a minimum of two clips of writing or advertising examples, preferably published, that you have authored. College class work may be submitted in place of clips by sophomore applicants who do not have clips. **Please send 8½-by-11 pages, one-sided, with no tape, staples or hanging materials.** Photocopies of your clips are OK. If submitting visual or multimedia samples, send direct links to URLs holding the samples.
6. Enclose a photocopy, or an original copy, of your most recent and current college transcripts.

You will be **DISQUALIFIED** if this form is not completed properly or if the required materials are not submitted along with this application. Successful grant finalists will receive notification in late November 2018. Four finalists will be selected to receive a \$2,500 internship grant based on successful interviews. Grant is awarded directly to finalist when internship begins.
