User-Friendly Dictionary—Advent

The first season of the church year, beginning with the fourth Sunday before Christmas and continuing through the day before Christmas, is called Advent. The name is derived from a Latin word for "coming." The season is a time of preparation and expectation for the coming celebration of our Lord's nativity, and for the final coming of Christ "in power and glory."




Two heralds of the season are in place at Emmanuel. First, the Advent wreath, a circle of greenery marked by four candles that represent the four Sundays of the season of Advent. An additional candle is lit as each new Sunday is celebrated in Advent. Advent wreaths are used both in churches and in homes for devotional purposes. The candles may be blue, purple, or lavender, depending on local custom. Some Advent wreaths include a white candle in the center known as the "Christ Candle," which is lit on Christmas Eve.

Second are the blue hangings on the altar and the lectern/pulpit (Hmmm, good words for another article!). Blue is the liturgical color for Advent. In years past it was purple, but the contemporary interpretation of the season's theme is one of contemplation, not repentance. Our altar hangings were made by former (now deceased) member Judy Carlton and they are a wonderful memorial of her and her years of service to Emmanuel. The advent banners were donated by Ryan Fitch, our organist/choir director.

A Note from Our Senior Warden

Greetings all and I hope you all had a safe and happy Thanksgiving!

With 'Turkey Day' behind us, before you know it the Christmas holidays will be upon us. Holiday parties, shopping, wrapping up those house and garden chores along with holiday gifts will be just a few of the many 'to do' items to tackle between now and Christmas Day. But I wanted to add to your 'to do' list by urging you to give some thought to what EEC means to you, as well as your friends and family.

December 11 marks the 'official' close of our 2017 Annual Giving Campaign — **Church of Dreams**. As you've probably been monitoring in our weekly bulletins, pledges are rolling in but not at the pace we would hope for by this time. For those of you who have submitted a pledge for 2017 — many, many thanks! For those of you who have yet to do so, please try to do so by Sunday, December 11, when the Annual Giving Team will present the pledge cards during the 10:30 a.m. service for a special blessing by Chuck and Joani.

We ask for your pledge by December 11 because by then the Emmanuel Finance Team will be hard at work banging out a 2017 budget that will need to be ratified by the Vestry by year end. Only until the Team has a good understanding of what we can expect in pledged giving can they accurately formulate next year's operating budget. Your planned giving commitment or pledge for 2017 will help us decide what outreach actions, staffing, and building improvements may be possible for next year.

But this year's campaign is not just about monetary giving. Rather, we challenged the congregation to consider pledging a gift of time and talent in 2017, also. One such way to do so is by committing 90 minutes a month to serve (along with 11 other members of the congregation) as a member of the EEC Vestry. We have vacancies for one 2-year term and three 3-year terms starting in February.

At that time, my term as Senior Warden will come to a close as I'm succeeded by our current Junior Warden, Adam Schildge. It's been an interesting and very rewarding ride which started off with my



selection as co-chair of the Search Committee (along with Lola Beggs) that resulted in Chuck's decision to accept our call to become the next rector of Emmanuel. In the nearly 4+ years since the Search Committee was convened, we've all witnessed remarkable growth in Emmanuel — not just in numbers, but in spirituality, mission and planned giving.

So this holiday season, please take a moment to contemplate what you could give back to God and Emmanuel, remembering the teachings of **Hebrews 13:16**: "Do not neglect to do good and to share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God."



IRA Rollover

For those aged 70 ½ or older, it is possible to make tax-favored charitable gifts from traditional and Roth IRA accounts. A total of \$100,000 may be transferred directly from traditional or Roth IRAs each year to one or more qualified charities, including Emmanuel Church and Emmanuel Church Foundation, free from federal income taxes. Contributions given in this way count toward the donor's required IRA minimum withdrawal amount for the year of the gift. However, they do not entitle the donor to a charitable income tax deduction.

To make such a gift, it is important that you have the donated assets distributed directly from your IRA to Emmanuel. For those with check-writing privileges on their accounts, this may be the most efficient way to make a gift directly from your IRA to Emmanuel.

If you are interested in making a gift of IRA assets to Emmanuel Church or the Emmanuel Church Foundation, please contact your IRA administrator for instructions on making a charitable transfer or, as noted above, simply write a check to Emmanuel from your IRA account.

Inclement Weather Policy

Emmanuel Episcopal Church follows the Alexandria City Public School (ACPS) system regarding closings for inclement weather. If Alexandria Public Schools are closed, then Emmanuel Episcopal Church is closed. All day and evening activities and meetings are cancelled. This applies to weekdays and weekends.

If Alexandria Public Schools have a late opening or an early closing then we will follow their lead as well.



This inclement weather policy includes the 8:00 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. Sunday services. If it is unsafe for the school system to be open, then it is unsafe for our church to be open. God will completely understand — yes, even applaud — your taking care of yourself and others by staying home.

In the event of a Sunday closing, an e-mail will be sent to all who currently receive the weekly e-news. The closure will be placed on the website as well.

The children are given daily opportunities to explore and learn through age appropriate toys and projects. They are encouraged to use their words to express their needs and



wants. The activities in the Red 2's classroom are developed to create learning experiences and social experiences through play, projects and activities.

In December, we will work on printing and stamping with the guidance of artist-in-residence Kathryn Coneway. The children use various loose parts, including bottle tops, toy shoes, spools, combs and much more, to dip into paint

The Red 2's love spending time on special projects in the Art Room, dressing up and grocery shopping in Dramatic Play and spending time observing our school pet, Boris the Tortoise, while playing in the Activities Room.
