



Steps for Consideration to Participate in the Kennedy Center DC Partnership Schools Initiative Student Centered Artist in Residency Program

Step 1: Apply for and participate in the Kennedy Center's Professional Development Series for Teaching Artists:

- (1) Defining Arts Integration
- (2) Residency Planning Seminar
- (3) Lesson Planning Seminar

Step 2: Submit and Receive Feedback on Your Residency Plan

You have the opportunity to receive feedback about the plan you develop prior to final submission. Telephone or e-mail consultation with Jeanette McCune, Director, School and Community Programs may be arranged. Submission of the Residency Plan you created must be submitted electronically to ismccune@kennedy-center.org 5 business days prior to the consultation.

Step 3: Submit Residency Plan For DC Partnership for Following Year Participation

To be considered for the Student Centered Artist in Residency Program, you must submit your final Residency Plan by XXX (date determined by director). Residency plans may be submitted via e-mail to ismccune@kennedy-center.org. Artists will receive notification of interest to continue in the application process by XXXX (date determined by director).

Step 3: Sponsor Observation and Residency Plan Revision

If selected to continue in the application process, artist will inform Kennedy Center of potential dates to be observed leading an arts education program in a school or community based environment. If requested, a revised Residency Plan will be submitted by _____.

Step 4: Invitation to Present a Residency

Teaching artists with the strongest Residency Plans will be invited to present their residency. Kennedy Center will attend select residency sessions and the artist will meet with the Kennedy Center to discuss the artist's self-assessment, the teachers' evaluations, and the Sponsors' comments about strengths and suggestions for improvement as part of the process.
