♦ 9/11 HISTORY UNVEILED

A piece of September 11, 2001 history is on display at the Cartersville Public Safety Building, 195 Cassville Rd. Cartersville Fire Chief Scott Carter said "this rather large section of steel weighing over 100 pounds is from one of the Twin Towers, It was donated to us from F.D.N.Y. after Lt. Chad Hendrix got the ball rolling in the spring." The steel is one of the clips that held the massive beams of the Twin Towers together. The stand displaying the steel was hand made by Cartersville Fire Lt. Steven Ogle. Police Chief Frank McCann said "we are honored to have a piece of the World Trade Center Twin Towers, it reminds us of the good people who lost their lives, including public safety personnel." You can also see law enforcement tools, historic photos and a 1918 American LaFrance fire truck, the first motorized firetruck purchased by the City of Cartersville to replace their horse drawn fire wagons. The display can be seen 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

♦ WOMAN MET SEX OFFENDER ON FACEBOOK

Bartow Deputies responded to the Cartersville hospital Thursday morning because a couple who were patients were in a domestic dispute. The woman said she was upset with Javar Omar Wilson, 35, because he wouldn't answer her text. He came into her exam room, they argued and she was afraid he would hit her. She said she met Javar on Facebook and they moved in together at the Guest House in June. Javar is an South Carolina sex offender absconder. He was convicted in 2011 for sexual indecency with a child. He faces many more charges.

Top News

- ♦ Three of the 77 confirmed Zika cases in Georgia are in Northwest Georgia. All the Ga. cases are travel related. Zika virus is transmitted primarily through the bite of infected Aedes aegypti mosquitoes but the Aedes alcopictus which is common in Ga. is also a carrier. Symptoms include a rash, fever, headache, joint pain or red eyes. There is no vaccine to prevent Zika. You should use EPA registered insect repellants containing 20-30% DEET, picaridin, oil of lemon eucalyptus or IR3535 during travel and for three weeks after returning home. Remember to continue emptying standing water from containers, flowerpots, buckets and old tires.
- ♦ The Consumer Financial Protection Bureau fined Wells Fargo \$185 million after 5300 employees created phony accounts which customers had to pay fees for. The company said those employees have been fired. Wells Fargo said \$2.6 million in refunds has been issued to customers for fees that were tied to unauthorized accounts.
- ♦ Governor Nathan Deal proposed a 20% pay raise to almost 3,300 state law enforcement officers plus an overhaul of officer training. The Law Enforcement Reform proposal will go into effect early next year.
