Dara Horn was born in New Jersey in 1977 and received her Ph.D. in comparative literature from Harvard University in 2006, studying Hebrew and Yiddish. In 2007 she was chosen by Granta magazine as one of 20 "Best Young American Novelists." She has published 4 award-winning novels. Her fourth novel, *A Guide for the Perplexed* was selected as one of Booklist's Best Books of 2013 and was longlisted for the Carnegie Medal for Excellence in Fiction. She has taught courses in Jewish literature and Israeli history at Sarah Lawrence College, City University of New York, and Harvard. She has lectured at over two hundred universities and cultural institutions throughout North America, in Israel and in Australia. Currently at work on her fifth novel, Dara Horn lives in New Jersey with her husband and four children.
