Home Builders Donate Scholarship Funds for NWACC Construction Technology Student *Gift Will Aid Students Interested in Residential Construction*

BENTONVILLE, Ark. (June 29, 2017) – The Northwest Arkansas Home Builders Association Foundation is providing an annual \$1,000 college scholarship for students interested in pursuing a career in residential construction.

Leaders of the Home Builders Association presented a check to Keith Peterson and Annetta Tirey of NorthWest Arkansas Community College on June 27. Peterson is dean of workforce

development at NWACC, and Tirey is executive director of development for the NWACC Foundation. The first scholarship will be awarded for the fall 2017 semester, and the student must be enrolled in the construction technology program at NWACC.

The College launched its associate degree program in construction technology in the fall of 2016. A representative from the Northwest Arkansas Home Builders Association Foundation serves on the advisory board for the program.

Marissa Fahrig, executive officer of the Northwest Arkansas Home Builders Association, said the organization has a strong interest in the College's construction technology program.
