

About our event – what makes it unique?

Would you rappel 24 stories because you believe in a cause? This summer, over 20 local non-profits are joining forces to go OVER THE EDGE in support of our community! In June, 140 individuals will be rappelling down the Brady Sullivan Tower at 1000 Elm Street in Manchester. These individuals are taking up this challenge because they believe in the strength of teamwork. They are committed to improving our community! Their supporters include friends, family, colleagues... even random strangers simply wanting to support their cause. In 2017, this event included only 70 participants and 10 teams... and raised OVER \$140K for the community. Imagine how amazing our event will be in 2018!



Sponsorship Package 2018

The event “Live United Over the Edge 2018” will be one of the biggest non-profit events of the year! In 2017 the event raised over \$140,000, included 10 different non-profits with 70 participants, included a VIP team led by Kelly Ayotte and Jamie Staton, was featured in the Manchester Union Leader, the front page of the Nashua Telegraph, WMUR’s evening news – not once, but twice, and was featured in New Hampshire Chronicle.... Not to mention hundreds and hundreds of social media posts, reposts, and likes.

This year, the event will be twice as big! There will be 140 participants, rappelling down the Brady-Sullivan Tower in downtown Manchester, raising over \$300,000 for 23 different non-profits including the United Ways of both Manchester and Nashua... again to be led by our amazing Ayotte/Staton VIP Team, and being joined in 2018 by Governor Chris Sununu. - Rope Sponsors (4 available) -- \$2,500 – every time a rappeler comes down on one of the four ropes, you will be recognized... all day long!




1. The fear factor – the majority of Americans are afraid of heights... but these rappellers are overcoming their fears BECAUSE they believe in community!
